Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On this Fourth Sunday of Easter, known as Good Shepherd Sunday, we hear Jesus say: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27). These words remind us that Christ, our Risen Shepherd, knows each of us intimately and calls us to follow Him with trust and love.

This Sunday also marks the World Day of Prayer for Vocations. We also give thanks today for all mothers, both living and deceased. On this Mother's Day, we honor and pray for those women who have nurtured us with love, faith, and sacrifice. May God bless them abundantly, and may our Blessed Mother Mary watch over all mothers with her tender care.

Finally, I invite you to join us this Tuesday, May 13, for our Rosary Procession and Mass in honor of Our Lady of Fatima. The procession will begin at 7:00 p.m. at St. Alphonsus Church and will conclude with Mass at the Cathedral. Let us come together in prayer, asking Our Lady to intercede for peace in our hearts and in the world.

Rejoicing with the Church: Welcoming Our New Holy Father

A Biography of Pope Leo XIV – The 267th Successor of St. Peter

We join the Church throughout the world in rejoicing and praying for our new Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, as he begins his ministry as the 267th Successor of St. Peter.

Pope Leo XIV, born Robert Francis Prevost, was elected to the Pontificate on May 8, 2025. He is the first Pope from the United States and only the second from the Americas. A member of the Order of St. Augustine, Pope Leo



XIV brings decades of experience as a friar, missionary, and Church leader to his role as the Bishop of Rome.

Early Life and Education

Born on September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois, Robert Prevost was raised in a devout Catholic family and active parish life. He earned a degree in Mathematics from Villanova University, entered the Augustinian order in 1978, and was ordained a priest in 1982. He later earned a doctorate in canon law in Rome at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas.

Priestly Ministry and Leadership

In 1985, Father Prevost began missionary work in Peru, serving as a seminary professor and pastoral leader in Trujillo. He was later elected Prior Provincial in Chicago and then Prior General of the worldwide Augustinian Order, a role he held from 2001 to 2013. In these positions, he earned a reputation for collaborative and compassionate leadership.

Bishop and Vatican Official

In 2014, Pope Francis appointed him as Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Chiclayo in Peru, later making him bishop in 2015. His episcopal motto, “In Illo Uno Unum” (“In the One, One”), reflected his Augustinian spirituality and commitment to unity. In 2023, he was appointed Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops and made a cardinal, playing a key role in the global appointment of bishops.

Spiritual Focus

Pope Leo XIV is known for his deep love of Christ, humility, and dedication to evangelization. Inspired by the teachings of St. Augustine, he emphasizes community, mercy, and a joyful witness of faith. Fluent in five languages and shaped by decades of international ministry, he brings a deeply pastoral and global perspective to the papacy.

Election as Pope

Cardinal Prevost was elected pope following the death of Pope Francis. He took the name Leo XIV, invoking the legacy of earlier popes known for their wisdom and leadership. His election is historic as the first American-born pope and the first from the Augustinian order.

A Pontificate of Unity and Hope

From the beginning, Pope Leo XIV has called for a Church that builds bridges and welcomes all in charity and truth. With warmth, clarity, and conviction, he has begun his papacy as a humble shepherd, dedicated to guiding the Church forward in unity, mission, and love.

LIVING OUR FAITH

Our Lady of Fatima: A Message for the World



On May 13, 1917, in the small village of Fatima, Portugal, three shepherd children—Lucia dos Santos and her cousins Francisco and Jacinta Marto—were tending sheep when they experienced a vision that would become one of the most beloved Marian apparitions in the Church. A “Lady dressed in white, more brilliant than the sun” appeared to them, identifying herself as the Lady of the Rosary. Over the course of six apparitions, from May to October 1917, she entrusted the children with a message that remains profoundly relevant today: a call to prayer, penance, and conversion.

The apparitions occurred during the turmoil of World War I and just before the rise of communism in Russia. Mary’s message emphasized the importance of praying the Rosary daily for peace and offered a prophetic warning about future suffering if people did not turn back to God. She also entrusted the children with three “secrets,” later revealed to include a vision of hell, a prediction of the Second World War, and the persecution of the Church and the Holy Father.

In the October 13 apparition, witnessed by tens of thousands of people, the “Miracle of the Sun” took place—an extraordinary event where the sun appeared to dance in the sky. This miracle was officially recognized by the Church and helped confirm the authenticity of the apparitions.

The message of Fatima continues to resonate. Pope John Paul II, who credited Our Lady of Fatima with saving his life after the assassination attempt on May 13, 1981, was deeply devoted to her. In 2000, he beatified Francisco and Jacinta, the youngest non-martyr children ever beatified, and in 2017, Pope Francis canonized them both during the 100th anniversary celebrations in Fatima.

In a world still marked by conflict, confusion, and sin, Our Lady’s invitation remains ever urgent. The Rosary is a powerful weapon for peace, and devotion to her Immaculate Heart is a sure path to Christ. May we answer her call with confidence, trusting that her maternal care will lead us closer to the Heart of her Son.

“In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph.” – Our Lady of Fatima



The month of May is the “month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady,” and it is the occasion for a “moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God’s mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance” (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practiced in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

Ways to Honor Our Lady

- Learn or pray a new Marian devotion (Regina Caeli, Litany of Loreto, Novenas to Our Lady, etc.)
- Decorate a statue of Our Lady with flowers
- Imitate Mary’s deep humility, obedience, and faith

PRAYER FOR THIS WEEK

Lord, source of eternal life and truth, give to your shepherd Pope Leo a spirit of courage and right judgment, a spirit of knowledge and love. By governing with fidelity those entrusted to his care, may he, as successor to the Apostle Peter and Vicar of Christ, build your Church into a sacrament of unity, love and peace for all the world. Catholic Life Explained:

Papacy

Question:

Why is the papacy important in the Catholic Church?

Answer:

The Papacy is the office and authority of the Pope, who is the Bishop of Rome and the spiritual leader of the worldwide Catholic Church. Catholics believe the Pope is the successor of St. Peter, whom Jesus appointed as the leader of His Church (Matthew 16:18-19). The Pope's authority is seen as a continuation of the role given to Peter, serving as a source of unity, guidance, and teaching for all Catholics.

The Papacy is important because it ensures the faithful transmission of the teachings of Christ, offering doctrinal clarity and unity to the Church. The Pope, as the Vicar of Christ, provides leadership not only in spiritual matters but also in maintaining the unity of the Church. His authority helps the Church navigate challenges while remaining true to the Gospel. Through apostolic succession, this authority has been passed down from St. Peter to the present Pope, ensuring continuity and stability within the Church.



CATHEDRAL MAINTENANCE FUND
