# RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me" (John 14:1). These words bring comfort and hope, especially in times of uncertainty. Jesus reminds His disciples that He is going to prepare a place for them, and that He Himself is "the way and the truth and the life."

As followers of Christ, we are called to trust in Him and to walk in His way each day. This means living with faith, even when we do not fully understand, and choosing love, patience, and kindness in our daily lives. When we stay close to the Lord, He leads us and gives us peace.

## St. Carlo Acutis: A Life Pointed Toward Heaven

### Remembering His Witness on His 35th Birthday

On Sunday, May 3, we remember what would have been the 35th birthday of Carlo Acutis, a young saint whose life continues to inspire Catholics around the world, especially the young.

Carlo was born in London in 1991 and raised in Milan, Italy. From an early age, he showed a deep love for God, particularly in the Eucharist. He attended daily Mass whenever possible, spent time in Eucharistic Adoration, and prayed the Rosary faithfully. For Carlo, the Eucharist was not just a devotion, it was the center of his life. He once famously said, "The Eucharist is my highway to heaven."

In many ways, Carlo was an ordinary teenager. He enjoyed soccer, video games, and working with computers. Yet what made him extraordinary was how he lived those ordinary interests with a clear focus on God. He used his skills to create a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles from around the world, helping others to grow in faith and reverence for the Real Presence of Christ.

Carlo died in 2006 at the age of 15 after a brief battle with leukemia. Even in his suffering, he offered his life for the Church and for the intentions of the Holy Father. His witness of faith, joy, and self-giving love has only grown stronger in the years since his death.

This past September, Pope Leo XIV canonized Carlo Acutis, together with Pier Giorgio Frassati, holding them up as models of holiness for our time. In his homily, the Holy Father described Carlo as "an invitation to all of us, especially young people, not to squander our lives, but to direct them upwards and make them masterpieces."

That message resonates deeply today.

In a world filled with distractions, noise, and constant digital engagement, Carlo shows that holiness is not only possi-

ble, it is attainable right where we are. He reminds us that technology, when used well, can become a tool for evangelization rather than a distraction from what truly matters. More importantly, he shows that a life centered on the Eucharist is a life transformed.



Carlo understood something essential, that the closer we are to Jesus in the Eucharist, the more we become the person we are meant to be. He did not wait for some future moment to take his faith seriously. He lived it fully, here and now.

As we remember Carlo on what would have been his 35th birthday, we are invited to follow his example. To spend time with the Lord in the Eucharist. To live our daily lives with purpose. To use our gifts in service of something greater than ourselves.

St. Carlo Acutis reminds us that holiness is not reserved for a few.

It is a calling for all.

The month of May is the “month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady,” and it is the occasion for a “moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God’s mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance” (Paul VI).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time.

## Ways to Honor Our Lady

- Learn or pray a new Marian devotion (Regina Caeli, Litany of Loreto, Novenas to Our Lady, etc.)
- Decorate a statue of Our Lady with flowers
- Imitate Mary’s deep humility, obedience, and faith

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Dominic Savio (1842–1857)

*Feast Day: May 6*

St. Dominic Savio was a young Italian boy and student of John Bosco, known for his remarkable holiness at a very young age. Born into a devout family, he showed a deep love for God early in life and made his First Communion at just seven years old, resolving to “rather die than sin.”



Under the guidance of Don Bosco, Dominic grew in virtue, charity, and joy. He formed a group among his peers called the “Company of the Immaculate” to encourage holiness and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Despite his youth, he was known for his kindness, purity, and desire to help others grow closer to God.

Dominic died at the age of 14 after a brief illness, leaving behind a powerful witness that sanctity is possible for everyone, even the young. Canonized in 1954, he is the patron saint of youth and a model of joyful holiness.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Catholic Life Explained:

#### Paschal Candle

#### Question:

What is the Paschal Candle?

#### Answer:

The Paschal Candle is a large, white candle that symbolizes the risen Christ, the Light of the World. It is one of the most important signs of the Church's liturgy during the Easter season.

At the Easter Vigil, the candle is blessed and lit from a new fire outside the church. In a darkened church, it is carried in procession as the light spreads from one flame to many, showing how Christ's Resurrection overcomes the darkness of sin and death.

The candle is marked with a cross, the Greek letters Alpha and Omega, and the current year, showing that Christ is the beginning and the end and is present today. Five grains of incense represent His wounds.

It burns throughout the Easter season and is later used at Baptisms and funerals, reminding us that we share in Christ's life and victory. In every way, the Paschal Candle proclaims: Christ is risen, and His light endures.
