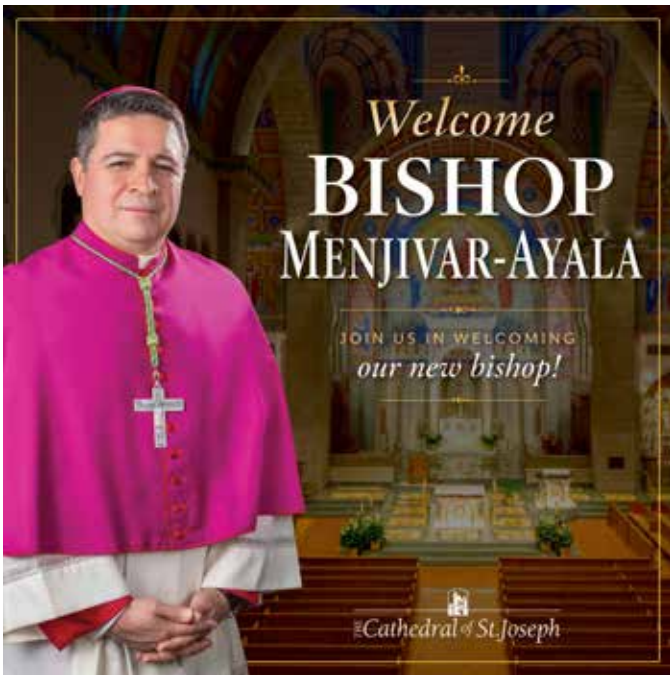

With gratitude to God, we rejoice in the appointment of our new bishop, Bishop Evelio Menjivar-Ayala, named on May 1 by Pope Leo XIV as the next shepherd of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

Bishop-designate Menjivar-Ayala, 55, will serve as the tenth Bishop of the Diocese of WheelingCharleston.

Bishop Evelio Menjivar was born on August 14, 1970, in Chalatenango, El Salvador. He migrated to the United States in 1990 and, in 2023, became Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Washington, becoming the first Salvadoran bishop in the country. He attended St. John Vianney College Seminary in Miami, Florida, earning a bachelor's degree in philosophy, and later studied at the North American College in Rome, where he obtained a master's degree in theology from the Pontifical University of Saint Thomas Aquinas ("Angelicum") in 2002. Before ordination, he pursued licentiate studies at the Pontifical Scalabrinian Institute for Pastoral Theology for Human Mobility in Rome. He was ordained to the priesthood for The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington on May 29, 2004, and speaks English, Spanish, and Italian.

In 2023, Cardinal Wilton Gregory named Menjivar Vicar General of The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington. He currently serves on several archdiocesan and national boards and committees, including the USCCB Committee on Communications. In 2024, Georgetown University awarded him an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree. Throughout his ministry, he has actively supported workers and promoted social justice for immigrants. Bishop Menjivar was ordained as an auxiliary bishop of Washington on February 21, 2023, by Cardinal Wilton Gregory at the Cathedral of St. Matthew the Apostle.

Bishop Menjivar will succeed Bishop Mark Brennan, who will remain as apostolic administrator of the diocese through July 1. The Mass of Installation will be celebrated on July 2, 2026, at 2:00 P.M., at the Cathedral of St. Joseph.

The faithful may obtain it by making a devout visit to the Cathedral during the Centennial Year and fulfilling the usual conditions: sacramental Confession, reception of Holy Communion, prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father, and complete detachment from sin.

# Our Lady of Fatima

## A Message of Prayer, Penance, and Hope That Still Matters Today

In 1917, as the world was being torn apart by war and uncertainty, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to three shepherd children in the small village of Fatima, Portugal. Between May 13 and October 13 of that year, Our Lady of Fatima appeared six times to Lucia dos Santos and her cousins, Francisco and Jacinta Marto, bringing a message that continues to speak powerfully to the Church and the world today.

The message of Fatima was both simple and urgent. Our Lady called for prayer, repentance, conversion, and peace. She especially encouraged the daily praying of the Rosary, asking the children to pray for the conversion of sinners and for an end to war. In a world marked by violence, confusion, and growing indifference to God, her message was a reminder that prayer truly matters and that every person is called to holiness.

One of the most well-known moments connected to Fatima took place on October 13, 1917, when tens of thousands gathered near the apparition site and witnessed what became known as the “Miracle of the Sun.” Numerous witnesses reported seeing the sun appear to spin, move, and radiate extraordinary colors before seeming to plunge toward the earth. The event was widely reported and helped draw worldwide attention to Fatima.

Yet the true heart of Fatima is not found in extraordinary phenomena, but in the call to deeper faithfulness.

The three children took Our Lady’s message seriously. Though very young, they devoted themselves to prayer and willingly offered sacrifices for the conversion of sinners. St. Francisco Marto and St. Jacinta Marto both died only a few years after the apparitions during the

influenza pandemic, and were canonized by Pope Francis in 2017. Lucia later became a Carmelite nun and spent her life spreading devotion to Our Lady’s message.

Fatima also reminds us of the importance of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Our Lady invited the faithful to entrust themselves to her maternal care so that she might lead them more deeply to her Son. Authentic Marian devotion always points to Jesus Christ. Mary never draws attention to herself alone; she continually leads us back to the Gospel.



The message of Fatima remains strikingly relevant today. We continue to see war, suffering, hatred, and spiritual confusion throughout the world. At the same time, many people carry personal burdens, anxiety, loneliness, and fear.

Fatima reminds us that God has not abandoned His people and that prayer and conversion remain powerful forces for renewal.

There is also something deeply hopeful about Fatima. Even amid warnings and calls to repentance, the Blessed Mother’s message was ultimately one of trust in God’s mercy and victory. One of the most famous lines associated with Fatima is Our Lady’s promise: “In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph.”

As we reflect on Fatima, we are invited to respond in simple but meaningful ways: praying the Rosary faithfully, returning regularly to Confession, participating devoutly in the Eucharist, and offering daily sacrifices with love.

The message of Fatima is not locked in the past.

It is a call that still echoes today, inviting us to turn back to God with renewed faith, hope, and trust.

The month of May is the “month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady,” and it is the occasion for a “moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God’s mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance” (Paul VI).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time.

## Ways to Honor Our Lady

- Learn or pray a new Marian devotion (Regina Caeli, Litany of Loreto, Novenas to Our Lady, etc.)
- Decorate a statue of Our Lady with flowers
- Imitate Mary’s deep humility, obedience, and faith

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Simon Stock (c. 1165–1265)

*Feast Day: May 16*

St. Simon Stock was an English Carmelite friar and one of the early leaders of the Carmelite Order. Drawn to prayer and solitude from a young age, tradition says he lived for a time as a hermit in the hollow of a tree, or “stock,” from which his name is believed to come.



As Prior General of the Carmelites, Simon helped guide the order during a difficult period of growth and transition in Europe. He is especially remembered for his deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the tradition of the Brown Scapular. According to Carmelite tradition, the Blessed Mother appeared to him in 1251 and entrusted the scapular as a sign of her protection and a call to faithful Christian living.

Saint Simon Stock’s life reflects devotion to Our Lady, perseverance in prayer, and trust in God’s care.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Catholic Life Explained:

#### Indulgences

#### Question:

What is a plenary indulgence?

#### Answer:

A plenary indulgence is the complete remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins that have already been forgiven. While Confession forgives sin, the effects of sin still remain. The Church teaches that this purification, called "temporal punishment," may be addressed through prayer, penance, charity, and ultimately through God's mercy. Through the authority given to the Church by Christ, indulgences apply the merits of Christ and the saints to aid in this purification. A plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment due to sin, while a partial indulgence removes only part of it.

To receive a plenary indulgence, a Catholic must ordinarily go to Confession, receive Holy Communion, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, and be free from attachment to sin, even venial sin. The faithful must also complete the particular indulgenced act prescribed by the Church, such as prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, reading Sacred Scripture, praying the Rosary, making a pilgrimage, or participating in certain Jubilee celebrations. If all the conditions are not fully met, the indulgence becomes partial rather than plenary.

Indulgences are not the forgiveness of sins themselves, nor are they a "shortcut to Heaven." Rather, they are a sign of God's mercy and the spiritual communion shared within the Church. Properly understood, indulgences encourage repentance, frequent
