

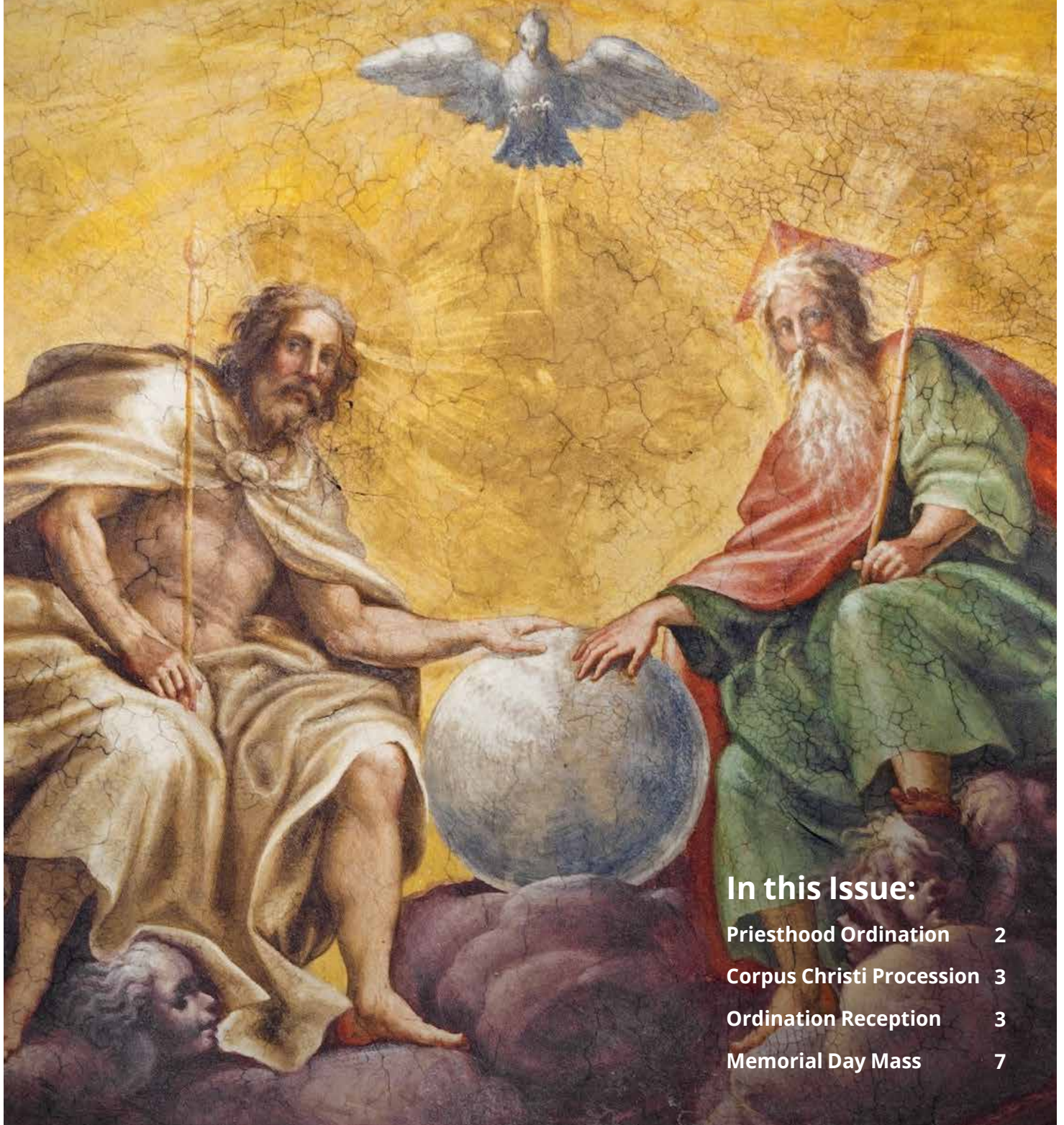

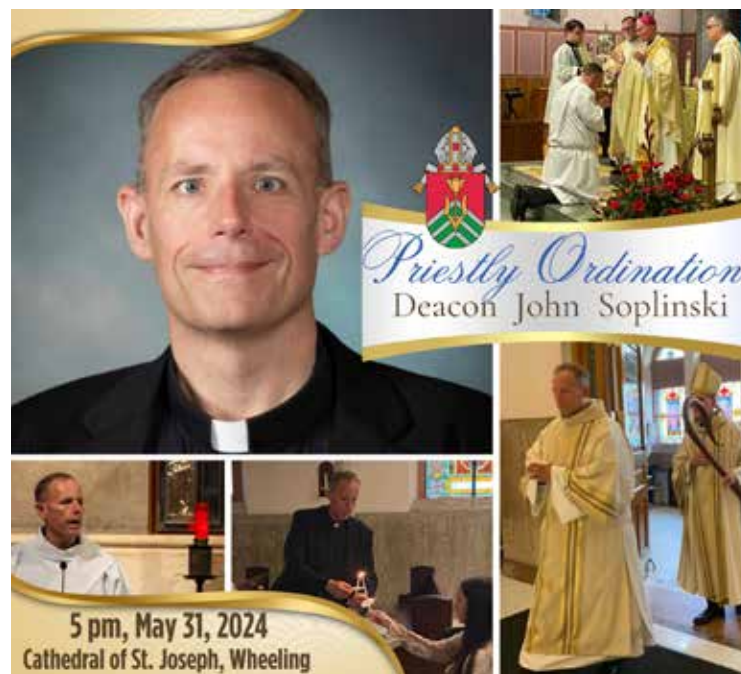
From Father Sateesh

"The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit are one because God's love is an absolute life-giving force; the unity created by love is a unity greater than a purely physical activity" (Pope Benedict XVI).



Just before Jesus ascends into heaven, he commands the eleven apostles, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you; and behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." (Matthew 28:19-20). The word "baptize" means "to immerse in, to plunge into." It presupposes the use of water. But what does it mean to be immersed in God's name? In the Bible, God's name is identical to God Himself. So, to be baptized into water, using Jesus' formula, is to be plunged into the life of God. Said another way, it is to die with Jesus and rise with him as a member of his body.

The Trinity isn't a doctrine simply to accept and ponder. It's more like an ocean: a mystery into which we are baptized ... inserted, immersed, dunked, plunged. Baptism gives us power to live our lives as beloved children of God, patterned after Jesus himself, who is always with us, until the end of the ages!

As we continue to celebrate the National Eucharistic Revival, everyone is invited to join us for our Corpus Christi Mass and Procession on Sunday, June 2, 2024. Come to the 10:30 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral, followed by a Procession of the Blessed Sacrament, with police escort, through the city streets of Wheeling to St. Alphonsus Church, Market Street. Upon arrival at St. Alphonsus, Benediction will be celebrated in the church, followed by a free catered meal in the parish gymnasium.

Permanent Diaconate Ordination

On Friday, June 7 at 3 p.m. at the Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart in Charleston, Bishop Mark Brennan will ordain 22 men permanent deacons. This will be the first permanent deacons ordained for the diocese since 2016.

Deacons are ordained to ministry and service where they assist the bishop and his priests in the celebration of the divine ministries, distribute holy Communion, assist, and bless marriages, proclaim the Gospel and preach the good news, preside at funerals and, most especially, dedicate themselves to the ministry of charity.

There are two types of deacons in the Catholic Church: the transitional deacon, who will go on to ordination to priesthood; and the permanent deacon, who is ordained for perpetual ministry.

One of the men to be ordained will be our own Mr. Jacob Manning. Please keep Jacob and the other men in your prayers as they prepare for their ordination on June 7!

To celebrate Jacob's upcoming ordination, there will be reception following the 10:30 a.m. Mass on Sunday, June 9 in the Great Hall of Central Catholic High School.

St. Joan of Arc (1412 – 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael, St. Catherine of Alexandria, and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiègne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.

Sunday, June 23 "Put Out into the Deep" on the Ohio River!

Bishop Mark Brennan and Bishop Paul J. Bradley, apostolic administrator of the Diocese of Steubenville, will board a stern-wheeler on Sunday, June 23, and lead a Eucharistic Procession down the Ohio River. Boater-cade with the two bishops leaves the Steubenville Marina at noon and will stop at four sites on both sides of the river where faithful can receive a blessing. Blessing sites: Steubenville Marina, Wellsburg Wharf, Wellsburg-Brilliant Bridge, and Heritage Port in Wheeling; Mazeroski Park (Ohio), and Pike Island Lock and Dam. Final destination is Bellaire Marina in Bellaire, Ohio.

Arrival of National Eucharistic Pilgrimage in Wheeling—7:30-8:30 p.m. Cathedral of St. Joseph. Bishop Mark E. Brennan and the faithful of Wheeling will welcome the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage at the Cathedral.

Carlo Acutis to be first millennial saint

Recognition of 2nd Miracle Paves Way for Canonization

A declaration on May 23, 2024, from the Vatican's Dicastery for the Causes of Saints has announced that another miracle has been attributed to the intercession of Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991-2006), meaning he will be canonized.

The miracle involved the healing of a young woman, 21, from Costa Rica, studying in Florence, Italy, who fell from her bicycle in July of 2022. She incurred a severe head injury and her situation was critical. After her mother went to pray at the tomb of Blessed Carlo in Assisi, the girl began to breathe on her own and within 10 days was discharged from the ICU.

Carlo Acutis was an Italian teenager known for his deep devotion to the Eucharist and his exceptional talent in computer programming, which he used to create a website documenting Eucharistic miracles. He led a devout Catholic life, attending daily Mass and praying the Rosary, and was noted for his kindness and generosity towards others. Diagnosed with leukemia at the age of 15, Carlo offered his suffering for the Pope and the Church, and he passed away in 2006, leaving a legacy of faith and inspiration for young people worldwide.

Traveling this Summer?

The month of May is the “month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady,” and it is the occasion for a “moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God’s mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance” (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

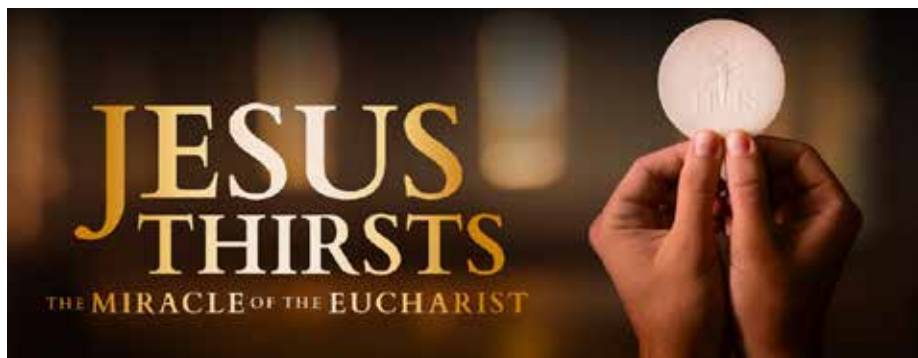
The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practiced in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

Ways to Honor Our Lady

- Learn or pray a new Marian devotion (Regina Caeli, Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Novenas to Our Lady, etc.)
- Decorate a statue of Our Lady with flowers
- Imitate Mary's deep humility, obedience, and faith

- **June 2: Solemnity of Corpus Christi**
We honor the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
- **June 7: Solemnity of Most Sacred Heart of Jesus**
This feast celebrates the incredible love that Jesus has for each of us.

We turn to Mary's pure love for God.

SAINTS OF THE WEEK

May 27 - St. Augustine of Canterbury, bishop (d.604)

St. Augustine was the first bishop of Canterbury and the founder of the Church in England, following a commission from Pope St. Gregory the Great. Augustine sought permission from King Ethelbert to evangelize in the south of England and sought to draw people to the light of Christ through the message of salvation for all, while affirming all that was good in their own traditions.

May 29 - St. Paul VI, pope (1897-1978)

Paul VI, who became pope during the Second Vatican Council, reminds us that the Sunday Mass is the primary place where evangelization takes place. The Church "exists in order to evangelize, that is to say, in order to preach and teach, to be the channel of the gift of grace, to reconcile sinners with God, and to perpetuate Christ's sacrifice in the Mass, which is the memorial of his death and glorious Resurrection" (*Evangelii nuntiandi*, 14).

June 1 - St. Justin, martyr (c.100-165)

Justin, also called Justin Martyr, drew from different systems of philosophy to demonstrate the truth of the Christian faith. Even in difficult times, we are called to remain steadfast in faith.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Deacons

Question:

How do I know if I have a vocation to be a deacon? What steps should I take next?

Answer:

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply.
