Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe which is the last Sunday in Ordinary Time. Next weekend we




begin the Season of Advent in preparation for the second coming of the Lord Jesus and his immediate birth. Since the announcement of his birth, the Only Begotten Son of the Father, born of the Virgin Mary, was described as "king" in the Messianic sense, that is, heir to the throne of David...for a Kingdom that would have no end.

The kingship of Christ remained completely hidden until he was thirty years old, years spent in an ordinary life in Nazareth. Then, during his public life, Jesus inaugurated the new Kingdom which does not belong to this world, and finally, with his death and resurrection, he fully established it. Appearing to the Apostles after he had risen, he said, "Full authority has been given to me both in heaven and on earth." This power flows from the love that God manifested in its fullness in the sacrifice of the Son. The Kingdom of Christ is a gift offered to the people every epoch so that those who believe in the incarnate Word may not die but have eternal life. Jesus established an eternal and universal kingdom, a kingdom of truth and life, a kingdom of holiness and grace, and a kingdom of justice, love, and peace. May our lives bear witness to this same God and Jesus Christ so that we who long for this kingdom may merit it through our belief in the all-powerful God!

This coming week on Friday, December 2, 2023, we will have our monthly Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament beginning immediately after the 12:05 p.m. Mass and concluding with Benediction at 5:00 p.m. What a great way to begin the Season of Advent! Pease make an effort to spend some time with Our Lord during this time of Adoration. There is a sign-up sheet on the table in the back of the Church to set a time for yourself.

## **Eucharistic Congress Pilgrimage**

On **July 17 to 21, 2024** the Church in the United States will gather as one family for a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, IN. This exciting event will be a five-day experience with prayer, Mass, Adoration, Catechetical sessions, fellowship, etc. with Catholics from around the country.

The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston was able to purchase 250 tickets at a discounted rate and Bishop Mark Brennan would like to make them available to members of the Catholic faithful at no cost.

Because of the large number of Catholics across the state, the Diocese has decided to allot 2 tickets for each parish. It is important to note that the complimentary ticket is only for entry into the venue. It does not include transportation, hotel, or meal costs. To help offset the cost for participants, the Diocese is partnering with Corporate Travel, the official pilgrimage partner of the National Eucharistic Congress, to make a comprehensive pilgrimage package available to participants at a discounted rate.



### We Are One in Him

In May 2023, for the first time in almost three quarters of a century, a monarch was crowned in England. A few days later a friend of mine scoffed, "What a waste of time and energy! What is the point of a king?"

I'm a proud American who wants neither theocracy nor monarchical restoration. I like our democratic republic. But the coronation of King Charles reminded me of something needed in every person and community: confidence in the future. The king's most basic role is to symbolize the unity of the nation. In England, the parliament members handle many of the practical duties of governance. But the king or queen can do what they cannot: embody in a single person the reality and future of a whole nation. To say, "this is our king" is to say, "we exist as a community, and we have a future." Kingship isn't primarily about the power of one person or family. It's about the enduring identity and unity of the whole.

To say Christ is our King is to say we exist as a people. We are one in him. We are, and we will be as long as he is. And since he will be our risen king forever, together we have a future filled with hope. Even the best countries will finally fall. But Christ and His Church will endure forever. What good news! It's not a waste of time to crown a king. We do it all the time. Let's be sure to crown the right one — the one whose kingdom never ends.


## **Christmas Caroling**

"It is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins," observes the writer of Maccabees in the Old Testament (2 Maccabees 12:45-46; quoted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, 958). Intercession on behalf of those who have died is a cherished tenet of our Catholic faith, springing from our belief in the resurrection of the body and the communion of saints. "Though separated from the living, the dead are still at one with the community of believers on earth and benefit from their prayer and intercession (Order of Christians Funerals, 6). Trusting in God's mercy, we continue to pray for them, knowing that this spiritual bond with our brothers and sisters who have died can never be broken. In the month of November, when we celebrate All Souls, we pray in a special way for those who have died — those who are known to us, and those known only to God.

#### Ways to Honor the Holy Souls

- Visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased
- Pray for the souls in purgatory with St. Gertrude's Prayer (see page 7)
- Perform acts of charity and sacrifices for the holy souls



## SAINTS OF THE WEEK

#### November 30 - St. Andrew, apostle (1st century)

St. Andrew was the first of the Twelve Apostles to meet Jesus. He was one of the two disciples of John the Baptist who saw John point out Jesus and say, "Behold, the Lamb of God" (John 1:36). Much like his younger brother, Simon Peter, Andrew was also a fisherman. Andrew's very name means strong and he was known for having good social skills. Little else is said about Andrew in the Gospels, but it is believed Andrew was one of the closer disciples to Jesus. Per Christian tradition, Andrew went on to preach the Good News around the shores of the Black Sea and throughout what is now Greece and Turkey. Andrew was martyred by crucifixion in Patras. He was bound, rather than nailed, to a cross, as is described in the Acts of Andrew. He was crucified on a cross form known as "crux decussata," which is an X-shaped cross or a "saltire." Today this is commonly referred to as "St. Andrew's Cross." It is believed Andrew requested to be crucified this way, because he deemed himself "unworthy to be crucified on the same type of cross as Jesus." From the cross, it is said that Andrew preached for two days. Patronage: fishing industry; fisherman; mariners

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Anointing of the Sick

#### Question:

If it isn't only for people who are dying, when should someone receive the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick?

#### Answer:

One of the unfortunate realities in the Church today is that so few people understand the meaning and value of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, largely because so many people still mistakenly think of this sacrament as "Last Rites" or "Extreme Unction."

In his life and ministry, Jesus healed the sick. In this sacrament, the Church continues the healing mission of Jesus and, in hope, prays that God will grant healing to the person who is suffering. But even if there is no physical healing, the sacrament offers spiritual healing through the Holy Spirit's gifts of peace and courage. And so, anyone who is living with serious illness (including emotional or psychological illness) and the elderly are encouraged to celebrate this sacrament when it is needed.

The ritual for Anointing of the Sick does also include special prayers and blessings for those who are facing death, including viaticum (communion given to the dying, trusting that the Lord Jesus will be their companion along the way, as they make their final journey).
