

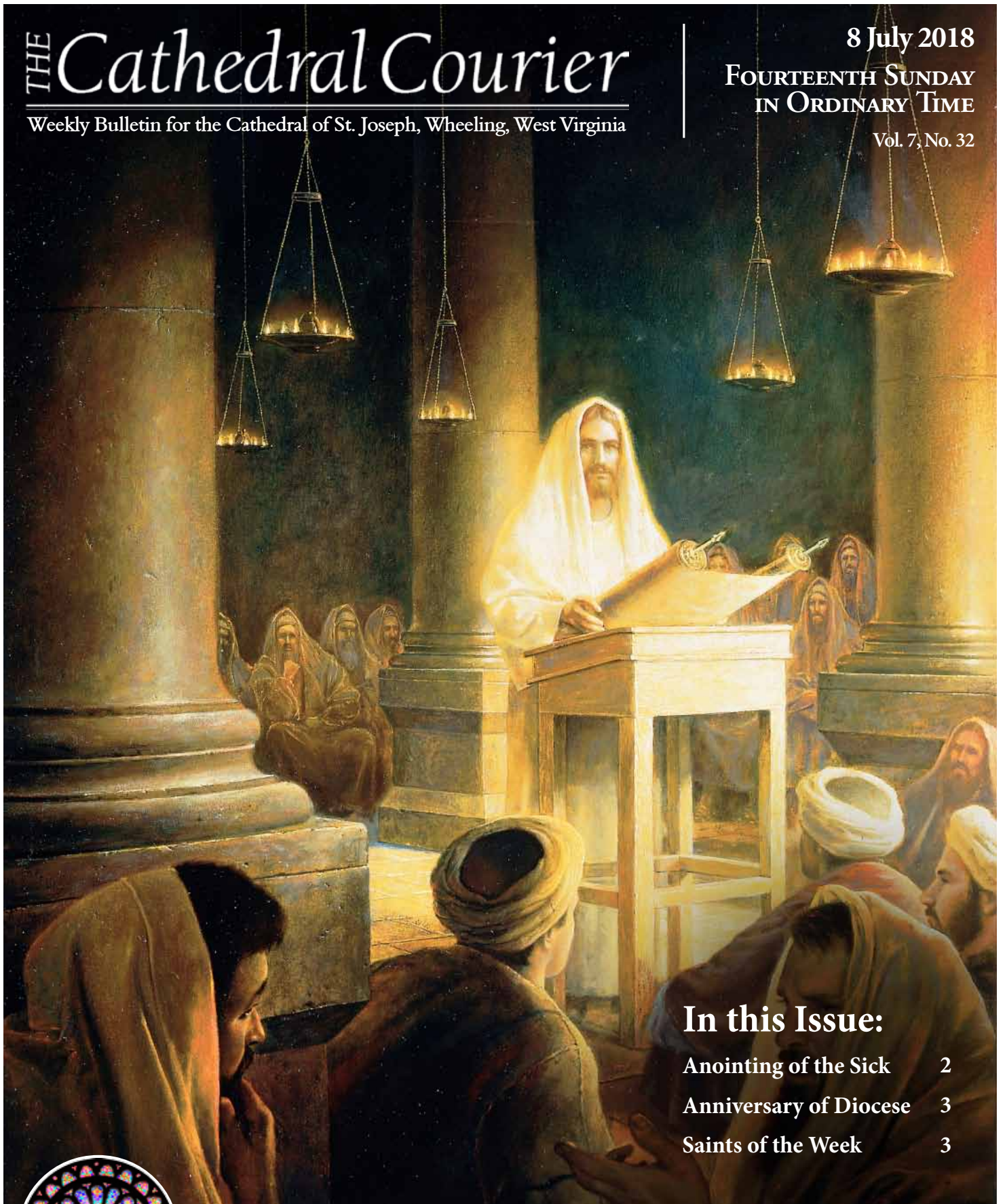

## Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Following the healings of the woman with hemorrhages and Jairus' daughter, Jesus and his disciples journeyed to his hometown. On the Sabbath, he taught in the synagogue where people question the source of his teachings and wisdom. Four questions populate this short Gospel passage. They center on Jesus' identity for the people in the synagogue who at first recognize his mighty deeds, then turned on him. Jesus' response is the familiar words that acknowledge the only place a prophet has no honor is the place where he grew up. Jesus and his disciples move on from this place whose people lacked faith. Yet it is not that they did nothing there since Mark informs us they healed a few people. A majority's lack of faith never silences the power of God in the face of a few who believe. Jesus came to set people free, not only from their physical, mental, and spiritual infirmities, but also from the worst affliction of all, the tyranny of slavery to sin, Satan, and the fear of losing one's life. Let us not hesitate to welcome Christ and his healing power into our midst. May we show Christ the honor and pride of place in our lives that he deserves as our Savior, Friend, and Redeemer. 🌿

"As we now approach the month devoted to honoring Christ's Blood - the price of our redemption, the pledge of salvation and life eternal - may Christians meditate on it more fervently, may they savor its fruits more frequently in sacramental communion." 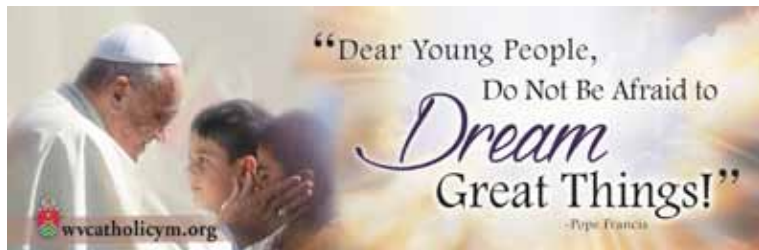


### The Pope's Monthly Intention for July

## Saints for the Week Ahead



**July 9** - The 120 martyrs honored on this day died between 1648 and 1930. Most of them (eighty-seven) were born in China and were children, parents, catechists, or laborers, ranging from nine years of age to seventy-two. The thirty-three foreign-born martyrs were mostly priests or women religious. Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese soldier who accompanied the prisoner Bishop John Gabriel Taurin Dufresse to his martyrdom in Beijing. Moved by the bishop's courage, Augustine sought baptism and not long after was ordained a diocesan priest. He was martyred in 1815.

**July 11 - Saint Benedict (480-553)**; wrote a famous monastic Rule noted for its wisdom, moderation, and need for obedience; founded twelve monasteries including Monte Cassino; Benedictines today number some 6,970 religious; considered the "Patriarch of Western Monasticism"; *Patronage*: Benedictines; Europe; happy death; students; cave explorers; against temptations

**July 21 - Saint Henry II (972-1024)**; together with his wife, St. Cunegunda, assisted the poor; as emperor, he respected the Church's freedom, fostering ecclesiastical and monastic reform; founded the See of Bamberg as a center for missions to the Slavs; *Patronage*: Benedictine Oblates

**July 21 - Saint Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680)**; born in Caughnawaga, Québec, led a life of great austerity and love in spite of ridicule and abuse; called "Lily of the Mohawks"; Pious woman who attended daily Mass, fasted twice a week, taught children, and cared for the sick; first native American to be declared "Blessed" (1980) *Patronage*: ecology; environment; orphans, exiles
