Saints Michael, Gabriel and Raphael—the Archangels



The liturgy celebrates the feast of these three archangels who are venerated in the tradition of the Church. Michael (Who is like God?) was the archangel who fought against Satan and all his evil angels, defending all the friends of God. He is the protector of all humanity from the snares of the devil. Gabriel (Strength of God) announced to Zachariah the forthcoming birth of John the Bap-

tist, and to Mary, the birth of Jesus. His greeting to the Virgin, "Hail, full of grace," is one of the most familiar and frequent prayers of the Christian people. Raphael (Medicine of God) is the archangel who took care of Tobias on his journey.

According to the 1962 Missal of St. John XXIII the Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite, Sept. 24 is the feast of St. Michael. St. Gabriel is observed on March 24 and St.

Raphael on October 24.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that, "[T]he existence of the spiritual, non-corporeal beings that Sacred Scripture usually calls "angels" is a truth of faith. The witness of Scripture is as clear as the unanimity of Tradition."

Angels are pure, created spirits. The name angel means servant or messenger of God.

Stewardship Thought

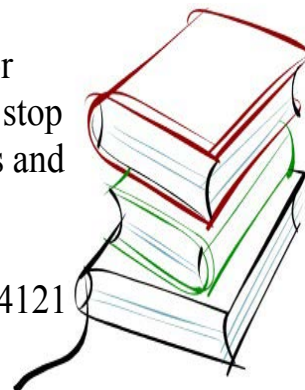
"What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?" Matthew 16:26

Monday—September 26th—Sts. Cosmas and Damian, martyrs

12:05p Mass for Jack Jochum
 RDGS: Jb 1:6-22 Ps 17:1bcd, 2-3, 6-7 Lk 9:46-50
Cosmas and Damian, died in 300 at Cyrrhus in Syria; brother physicians known as "moneyless ones" for their gratuitous care of the sick; mentioned in the Roman Canon; patrons of physicians, surgeons, druggists, barbers, and the blind.

Tuesday—September 27th—St. Vincent de Paul, priest

12:05p Mass for Lucy Mae Jenkins Bauquin
 RDGS: Jb 3:1-3, 11-17, 20-23 Ps 88:2-8 Lk 9:51-56
Vincent de Paul, died in 1660 in Paris; born in Pouy; renewed the clergy and defended the poor and the abandoned; founded the Congregation of the Missions, today numbering some 3,830 members; mission preachers and seminary educators; with St. Louise de Marillac, founded the Daughters of Charity; preached against Jansenism; patron of charities, of hospitals and prisoners, and of the Malagasy Republic (Madagascar).

Wednesday—September 28th—Saint Wenceslaus, Martyr; Saint Lawrence Ruiz, and Companions, Martyrs

12:05p Mass for Dale Shutler
 RDGS: Jb 9:1-12, 14-16 Ps 88:10b-15 Lk 9:57-62
 7:00p Choir Rehearsal
Wenceslaus, died 929 at age twenty-two; duke of Bohemia; sought to bring the faith to his people; killed by his pagan brother, Boleslaus; patron of the Czech Republic and Slovakia.

Today the Church commemorates sixteen martyrs of Nagasaki, Japan, during the years 1633-1637; they include nine Japanese, four Spaniards, one Frenchman, one Italian, and the Filipino, Lawrence Ruiz, the father of a family and protomartyr of the Philippines; after enduring horrible tortures, their bodies were burned and their ashes scattered by order of the ruler, Tokugawa Yemitsu; canonized 18 October 1987.

Thursday—September 29th—SAINTS MICHAEL, GABRIEL AND RAPHAEL, ARCHANGELS

12:05p Mass for Ron Radcliffe
 RDGS: Dn 7:9-10, 13-14 Ps 138:1-5 Jn 1:47-51
 These biblical messengers signify God's transcendence and

loving care: Michael (meaning "Who is like God?"), Gabriel ("God's Strength") and Raphael ("God's Remedy"); Michael: patron of security forces and of the sick; Gabriel: of telecommunications and the postal service; Raphael: of travelers and the blind.

Friday—September 30th—St. Jerome, priest, doctor of the Church

12:05p Mass for Thomas J. Klug
 RDGS: Jb 38:1, 12-21; 40:3-5 Ps 139:1-3, 7-10, 13-14b Lk 10:13-16
Jerome, died 420 in Bethlehem; from Dalmatia; devoted monk and ascetic; wrote numerous commentaries on and authored Latin ("Vulgate") translation of the Bible; one of the four great doctors of the Latin Church; patron of scriptural scholars.

Saturday—October 1st—St. Therese of the Child Jesus, virgin, doctor of the Church

Therese, "The Little Flower," died in 1897 of tuberculosis in Carmel of Lisieux at age twenty-four, born in Alencon; contemplative who, in her biography, "The Story of a Soul", urged all to follow "the little way"; proclaimed doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II in 1997; patroness of the missions, of florists, and of France; secondary patroness of the Apostleship of Prayer.
