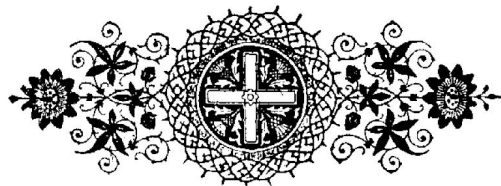
GLORIA
