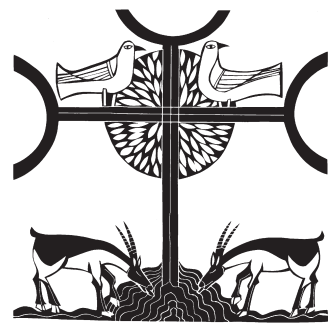
GLORIA
