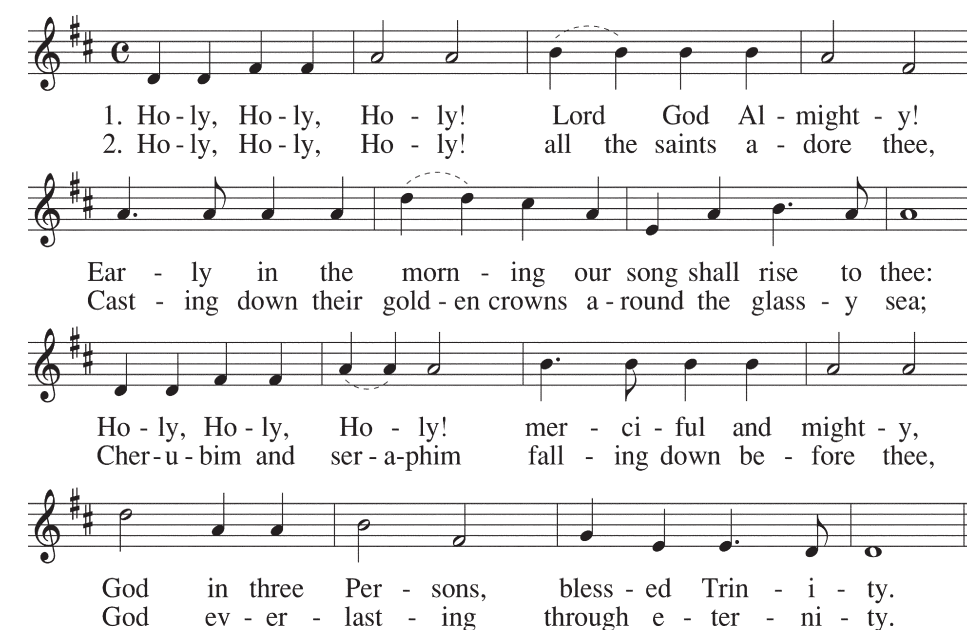

HOMILY

RITE OF BAPTISM

(During the 10:30 Mass)

The Litany of Saints is chanted as the faithful proceed to the baptismal font.

When all are gathered at the font, the priest leads the faithful in the renunciation of sin and profession of faith.

At the conclusion of the baptism, all join in singing the following acclamation:

You have put on Christ, in him you have been baptized. Alleluia, alleluia.

Following the Rite of Baptism, the Profession of Faith and the Universal Prayer are both omitted, and the Preparation of the Gifts begin.

 and became man.

 he suffered death and was buried,
 and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.
 He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
 He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead
 and his Kingdom will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
 who proceeds from the Father and the Son,
 who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified,
 who has spoken through the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.
 I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins
 and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead
 and the life of the world to come. Amen.
