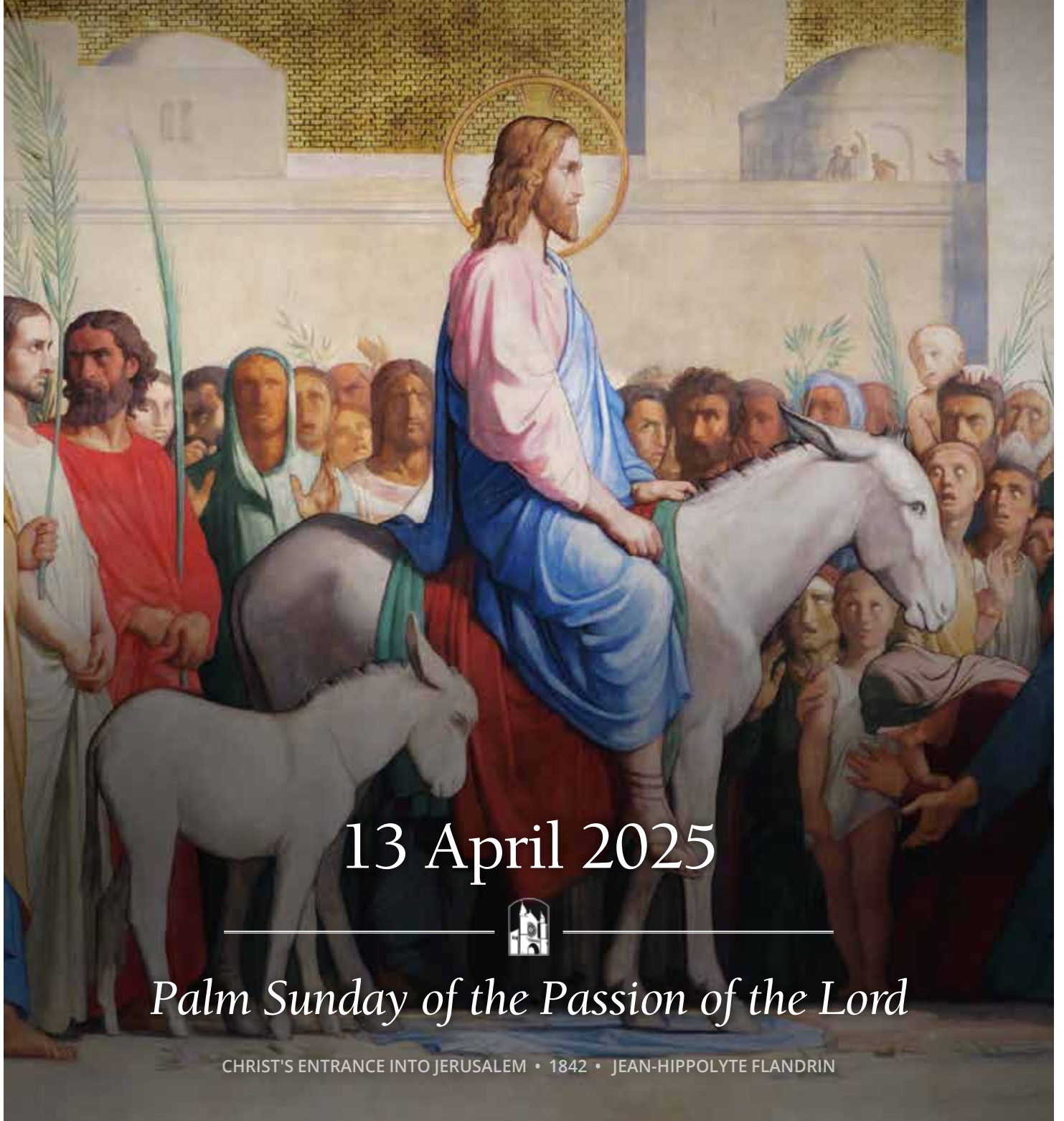

# RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Today we begin Holy Week, the most sacred time in the life of the Church. With Palm Sunday, we remember Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, where He was welcomed with joy—"Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Mark 11:9). Yet in the same liturgy, we also hear the account of His Passion and death. This dramatic shift reminds us that our Lord freely chose to suffer and die out of love for us, so that we might have life in Him.

I encourage you to take this week seriously. Do not let it pass by like any other. Make time in your schedule to enter into the beautiful and ancient liturgies of Holy Week, especially Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil. These are not only rituals—they are moments of grace that draw us into the heart of our faith. If you have a family, bring them with you. Let them see how deeply we love Jesus.

As we look toward Easter Sunday, I also invite you to do something very meaningful: reach out to someone who hasn't been to Mass in a while. A neighbor, a friend, even a family member—perhaps someone who has been waiting for an invitation. A simple word from you may be what they need to come back and experience the joy of the Risen Lord. What greater gift can we offer than to help someone encounter Christ again?

Let us walk with Jesus this week—through the cross and toward the empty tomb—with hearts open to His mercy and love. And let us help others walk with Him too.

## Day of Fasting & Abstinence

**Good Friday is an obligatory day of fasting and abstinence for Catholics.** For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. Members of the Eastern Catholic Churches are to observe the particular law of their own sui iuris Church. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.

There is an ancient Roman tradition to visit multiple churches after the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday night and to pray and "keep watch" before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose in each of those churches. **In the spirit of this tradition, everyone is invited to join the faithful of the Wheeling area for a Holy Thursday Pilgrimage this year on the evening of April 17th.** During the pilgrimage, the faithful will have the opportunity to visit six churches in the Wheeling area to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. A special booklet has been created which allows the pilgrims to follow along the narrative of Jesus' time in the Garden of Gethsemane as well as provide opportunities for personal prayer and meditation.

JESUS I TRUST IN YOU

The Divine Mercy devotion is a powerful reminder of God's boundless love, revealed to St. Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s. Through her, Jesus invited the world to trust in His mercy—especially for sinners and those in greatest need.

At the center of the devotion is the Divine Mercy image of Jesus with rays of red and pale light shining from His heart, representing the blood and water that flowed from His side. The words beneath the image, "Jesus, I trust in You," express the heart of the devotion: deep trust in God's mercy and a call to be merciful to others.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet, prayed using the rosary, is a powerful intercession for the whole world. Jesus promised special graces to those who pray it with trust.

**The Divine Mercy Novena begins on Good Friday and leads up to Divine Mercy Sunday (the Second Sunday of Easter).** Each day of the novena has a unique intention given by Jesus, including prayers for sinners, priests, and those who have lost faith.

More than a devotion, Divine Mercy is a way of life—living with trust in God and showing mercy to others. In a world so wounded, the message remains urgent and clear: *Jesus, I trust in You!*

## April Month of the Holy Eucharist

The month of April is dedicated to devotion to the Holy Eucharist. This tradition has developed because Easter Sunday often falls in April, and when it does fall in March, the Easter season continues on through all of April. In essence, April is a month of Easter, and during the Easter celebration we remember the Eucharistic sacrifice Christ gave us and the baptism in the Holy Spirit, which would come after Jesus's resurrection.

At the Last Supper, surrounded by His Apostles, Jesus gave to the world the most sublime gift of His Real Presence by instituting the Sacrament of the Eucharist – His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Jesus took bread and pronounced the words: "Take and eat, this is my Body"; then He took a cup of wine and said: "Take and drink, this is my Blood. Do this in memory of me." With these words Jesus instituted the greatest of all of the Sacraments, the Sacrament of the most Holy Eucharist.

### Ways to Honor the Holy Eucharist

- Truly prepare yourself to receive Christ in the Holy Eucharist by arriving early to Mass and spending time in prayer.
- Spend time in Eucharistic Adoration
- If you are not in the state of grace before receiving Holy Communion, go to confession

## Celebrating the Week That Changed the World

Holy Week is the week that changed the world. As we enter this most important week of the year, we invite you to reflect on its powerful significance and how it leads us to the heart of our faith.

**Palm Sunday** begins with a joyful procession of palms and the solemn reading of the Passion. We turn our hearts to Jerusalem and join the crowds shouting, "Hosanna!" Christ entered the Holy City to suffer, die, and rise again—so that we might be saved. This day reminds us to follow Him faithfully to the new and eternal Jerusalem: Heaven.

The **Chrism Mass** is celebrated by Bishop Brennan on Tuesday. The oils used in the Sacraments are blessed, and priests from across the diocese renew their promises. This beautiful liturgy reminds us of our own baptismal anointing and the priestly ministry Christ continues through His Church.

**Holy Thursday** marks the end of Lent and the beginning of the **Paschal Triduum**. We gather to remember the gift of the priesthood and the institution of the Holy Eucharist. With the washing of feet, we recall Christ's command to love as He has loved us. After Mass, we keep watch with Jesus at the altar of repose.

**Good Friday** is the day we fix our gaze on the Cross. In silence and solemnity, we venerate the wood on which hung our salvation. Through the reading of the Passion and the reception of Holy Communion, we unite our own sufferings to Christ and die to sin with Him.

**Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday** are the heart of the Christian year. At the Vigil—the "Mother of all Vigils"—we rejoice in the light of Christ, hear the story of our salvation, welcome new members into the Church through Baptism, and celebrate the Resurrection. On Easter morning, we echo the joy of the empty tomb: *The Lord is Risen! He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia!*

In a recent survey of WV Catholics, it was reported that the overwhelming majority cherish their faith, but only 18% feel comfortable talking about it, said Fr. John Rice in a recent homily at Mass for the Chancery staff.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Catholic Life Explained:

#### Easter Duty

#### Question:

What is the Easter Duty?

#### Answer:

The Easter Duty is one of the Church's basic requirements for Catholics: to receive Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter season. This is outlined in the Code of Canon Law: "Each of the faithful is obliged to receive holy communion at least once a year... during the Easter season unless it is fulfilled for a just cause at another time" (Can. 920).

The Catechism (CCC 1389) also teaches that this Communion should be preceded by Confession, especially if one is conscious of serious sin. While this obligation is the minimum, the Church encourages the faithful to receive both the Eucharist and Reconciliation regularly—even weekly or daily.

This precept highlights the deep connection between the Resurrection of Jesus and the gift of the Eucharist. Easter, the "feast of feasts," is the ideal time to unite ourselves with Christ in Holy Communion and to renew our spiritual life through the sacraments.

As Lent draws to a close, it's good to ask: Have I made a good confession since Ash Wednesday? If not, now is the time. Jesus offers us the abundance of His mercy and grace through these sacraments—let us not miss the opportunity.

As St. John Paul II reminded us: "It would be foolish... to claim to receive forgiveness while doing without the sacrament which was instituted by Christ precisely for forgiveness" (Reconciliation and Penance, 31).
