# RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

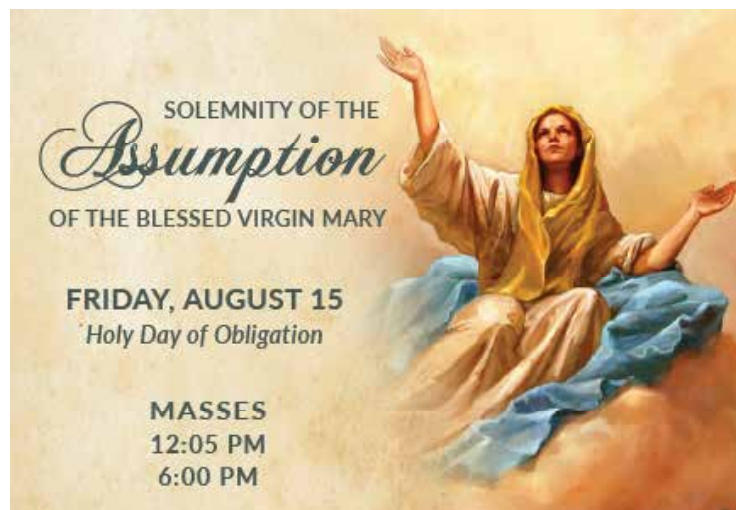
In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us: "Do not be afraid any longer, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32). He urges us to stay vigilant, like servants waiting for their master's return. We do not know the day or the hour, but the Lord calls us to be ready - not with fear, but with faith and joyful trust.

That faith is beautifully described in today's second reading from Hebrews: "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Abraham is praised for his faith because he obeyed and trusted, even when he didn't understand where God was leading him. Each of us is invited to walk in that same trust—ready to respond to the Lord, generous with what we have, and hopeful in what He promises.

This Friday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day that lifts our eyes toward heaven. Mary was taken body and soul into glory and in that we see the fulfillment of God's promise for those who live in faith. Please make time to attend Mass and honor Our Blessed Mother. Ask her to help you live with the same spirit of watchfulness and trust that she showed throughout her life.

Let us not grow lazy or distracted, but remain awake and faithful, with hearts open to the Lord and hands ready to serve. "Blessed is that servant whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival" (Lk 12:43).

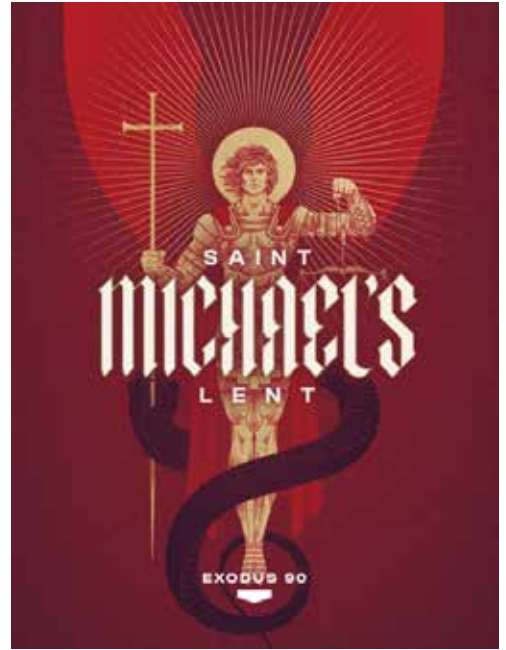

## St. Michael's Lent Starting August 15 A Call to Prayer, Discipline, and Brotherhood

St. Michael's Lent is a 40-day period of spiritual renewal rooted in the tradition of St. Francis of Assisi, who began this devotion in the 13th century as a time of prayer and fasting in honor of St. Michael the Archangel. Beginning on August 15—the Solemnity of the Assumption—and continuing through September 29, the Feast of the Archangels, this season calls men to deeper prayer, discipline, and fraternity. Guided by the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, Fr. Innocent and Fr. Angelus, participants will receive weekly reflections and encouragement rooted in the Franciscan spirit.

All men of the parish are invited to join this powerful journey through Exodus 90—a path already walked by over 100,000 men worldwide. 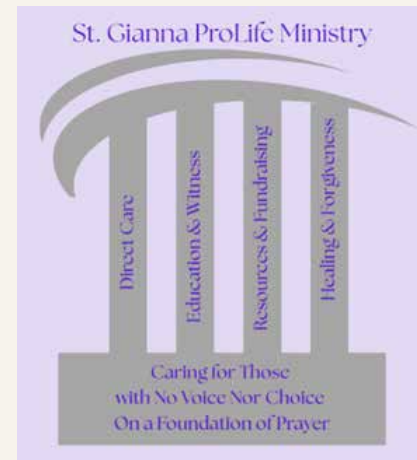



The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary takes place on the day after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, usually in June, but in this month when we celebrate Mary's Assumption (August 15) and her Coronation or Queenship (August 22), we also give honor to her Immaculate Heart. There are many prayers to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Here is one short enough to memorize and pray every day during this month: "O Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary, obtain for me from Jesus a pure and humble heart."

## Ways to Honor the Immaculate Heart of Mary

- Wear the Miraculous Medal
- Consecrate yourself to the Immaculate Heart
- Pray the Rosary

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Tarcisus (3rd century)

*Feast Day: August 15*

Saint Tarcisus was a young Roman martyr who gave his life to protect the Holy Eucharist during a time of intense persecution in the early Church. Though little is known about his life, tradition holds that he was entrusted with carrying the Blessed Sacrament to imprisoned Christians who could not attend Mass.



While on his way, he was attacked by a mob who demanded to see what he was carrying. Rather than hand over the Eucharist to profanation, Tarcisus refused and was beaten to death, dying with the Eucharist pressed to his heart.

He is honored as a patron of altar servers and a model of youthful courage and love for the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist.

### WHY DO WE DO THAT?

**Catholic Life Explained:**

*Parish Registration*

#### Question:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

#### Answer:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled.

Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.
