## RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

In today's Gospel, Jesus says, "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" His words remind us that the Christian life is not passive. Following Christ demands passion, courage, and sometimes even division when the values of the Gospel stand in contrast to the ways of the world. Our faith should be like a living flame that cannot be hidden, a light that guides others to the truth of Christ.

This Thursday at 6:00 p.m., our parish will begin an important journey together. We will launch a five-part series designed to help us grow as Eucharistic Missionaries. This effort follows the national three-year Eucharistic Revival called for by our bishops. While the formal movement concluded, the work of renewal continues here at the local level. Each session will help deepen our love for Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament and equip us to share that love with others through our words, actions, and example. I encourage everyone in the parish to take part in this study as a way to strengthen your faith and share the gift of the Eucharist more fully.

Finally, I encourage you to join us this Friday, August 22 at the 12:05 p.m. Mass as we celebrate two important occasions: the 175th Anniversary of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston and the Sixth Anniversary of Bishop Mark Brennan's installation as our shepherd. Let us give thanks for our diocese, for the gift of our bishop, and for the ways the Holy Spirit continues to guide our local Church.

May the Lord set our hearts on fire with His love, so that we can be bold witnesses of the Gospel in our families, workplaces, and communities. Let us pray for one another, that we may have the courage to live our faith without compromise and invite others to encounter Christ in the Eucharist.

## Annual St. Monica Mass and Novena

Novena prayed August 18 - 26; Mass on August 27 at 6:00 p.m.

We will once again host our annual St. Monica Mass on Wednesday, August 27 at 6:00 p.m. This special liturgy is a time for us to gather as one family of faith and pray for our loved ones who have left the practice of the Catholic Faith, whatever the reason may be.

Our devotion to St. Monica, patron saint of mothers and a model of perseverance in prayer, is rooted in her own inspiring story. She spent decades praying for the conversion of her son, St. Augustine, who went on to become one of the Church's greatest saints and Doctors. Her witness reminds us never to lose hope in God's power to bring about conversion, healing, and renewal.

**In the days leading up to the Mass, we will pray the St. Monica Novena from August 18 through August 26.**

During the novena, an icon of St. Monica will be displayed in the church. In front of it will be a basket with prayer cards. We invite you to write down the names of those for whom you are praying and place the cards in the basket. These names will be remembered each day during our novena prayers and at the St. Monica Mass itself.

We warmly encourage everyone to take part in this meaningful tradition—whether by attending the novena and Mass, or by uniting in prayer from home—as together we place our trust in the Lord's mercy and follow St. Monica's steadfast example of faith-filled perseverance.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Helena (c.250 – c.330)

Feast Day: August 18

Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine the Great, is remembered for her deep Christian faith and her role in promoting the Church after Christianity was legalized in the Roman Empire. Born of humble origins, she became a Christian later in life and used her influence to support the faith throughout the empire.

In her later years, Helena made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, where she was devoted to preserving and honoring the sites of Christ's life, death, and resurrection. Tradition holds that she discovered the True Cross on which Jesus was crucified. She also ordered the construction of churches in Jerusalem and Bethlehem, including the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and the Church of the Nativity.

Revered for her piety, generosity, and devotion to Christ, she is honored as a patron saint of archaeologists and converts.

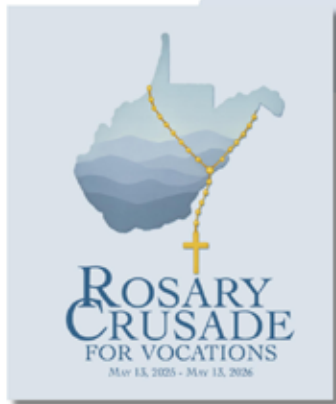

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained: *Queenship of Mary*

### Question:

Why is it so important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

### Answer:

For many of us, the language of kings and queens may seem like they belong to history or a medieval movie. Royalty have absolute authority over a kingdom and their subjects, a concept that is foreign to many of us today. While Jesus doesn't rule a political kingdom, we honor and recognize him as the King of Kings, Lord of Heaven and Earth. To God alone belongs absolute authority over all of existence.

We may think of queens as the spouse of the king, but there is another key relationship: the king's mother. In Biblical history, we see instances where the mother of the king is given due as a queen herself, complete with a throne! Mary's guiding influence over her Son is seen most notably in the Wedding Feast at Cana. Mary is not Queen on her own merit. She is "full of grace" and "blessed" in "all ages" because of the reign of her Son.
