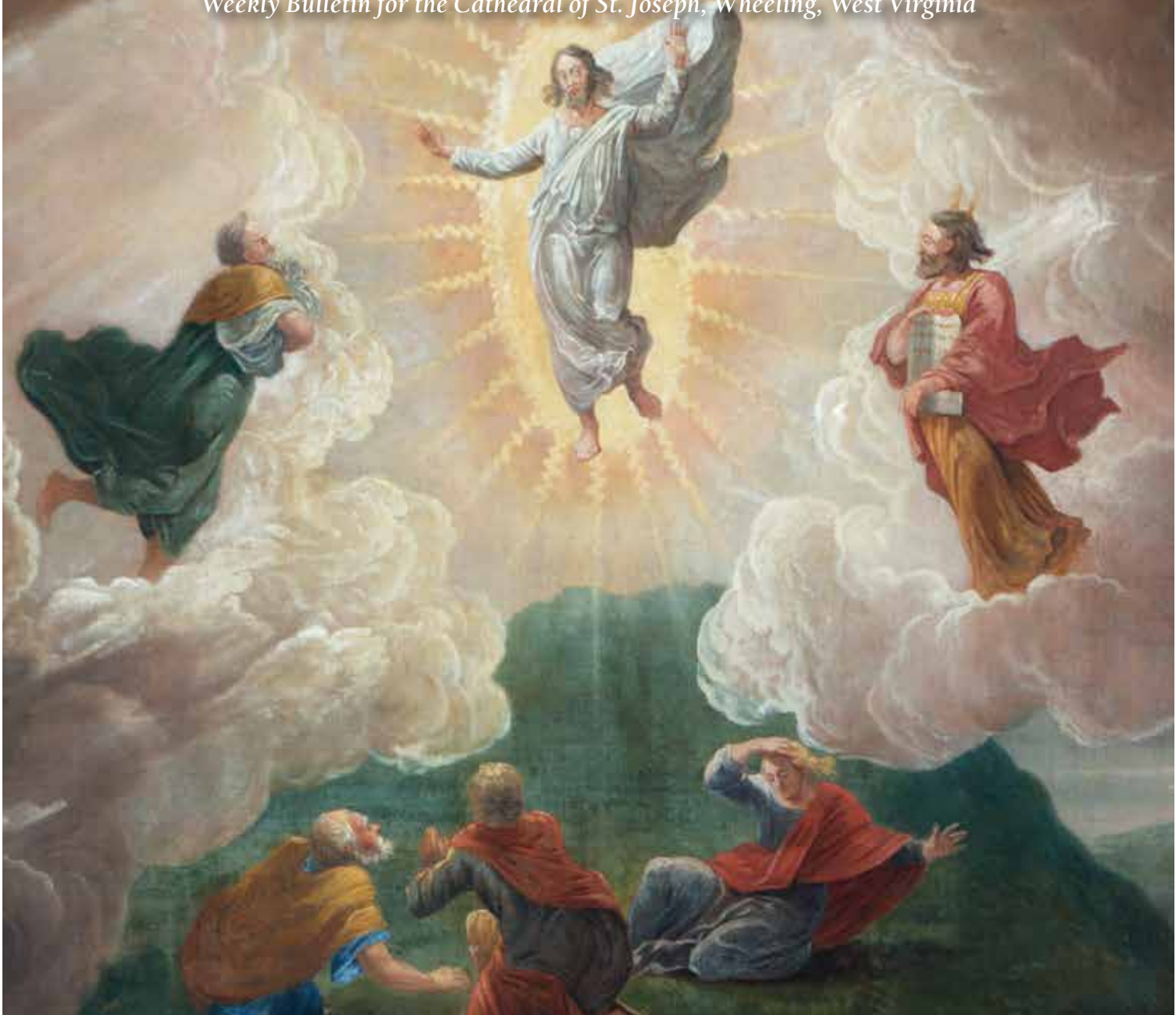

RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of a man who stores up wealth for himself and says, "You have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!" But God calls him a fool and says, "This night your life will be demanded of you" (Luke 12:19-20). The lesson is clear: we must not put our trust in things that do not last. True riches are not measured in possessions, but in a life lived for God.

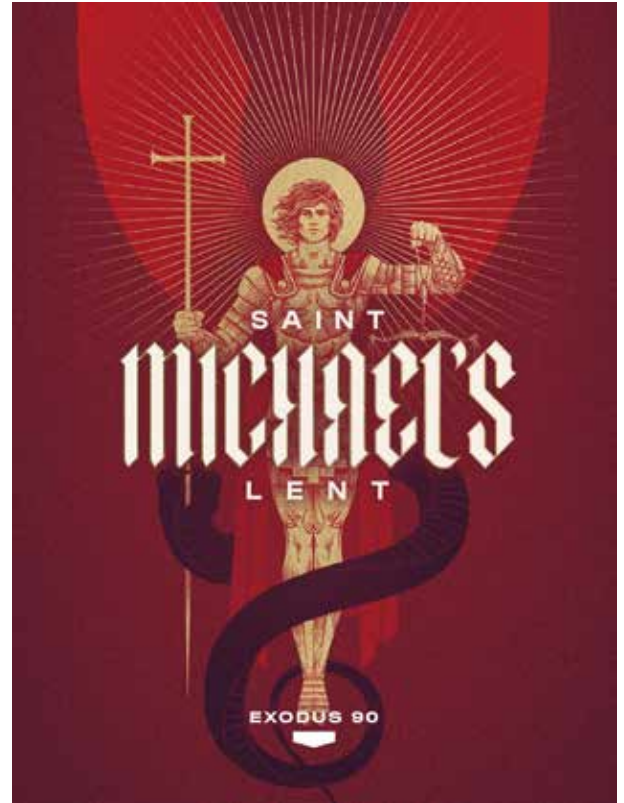
St. Michael's Lent Starting August 15

A Call to Prayer, Discipline, and Brotherhood

Prayer, discipline, and friendship are pillars of the spiritual life—but it can be difficult to know how to pursue them and even harder to stay on track. That's why the men of our parish are invited to take part in St. Michael's Lent, a 40-day period of spiritual renewal inspired by the example of St. Francis of Assisi.

Though less well-known than Lent before Easter, St. Michael's Lent is a long-standing Catholic tradition. St. Francis began observing this penitential season in the 13th century, dedicating it to prayer and fasting in honor of St. Michael the Archangel. He believed that just as the holy Archangel defends the Church in the spiritual battle, so too must each Christian man take up arms through prayer and self-denial for the good of his soul and the protection of others.

This year's St. Michael's Lent begins on August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and continues until September 29th, the Feast of the Archangels: Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael. Over those forty-five days, men will be invited to pursue greater freedom in Christ through prayer, asceticism, and fraternity—following a path that over 100,000 men worldwide have already walked through Exodus 90.



This year's spiritual guides are two Franciscan Friars of the Renewal, Fr. Innocent and Fr. Angelus, who will accompany participants with weekly videos, reflections, and encouragement rooted in the Franciscan spirit.

We invite all men of the parish—of every age and stage of life—to join us. Whether you're looking to jumpstart your spiritual life, deepen your relationship with God, or simply walk alongside other men who desire holiness, St. Michael's Lent is for you. 

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. 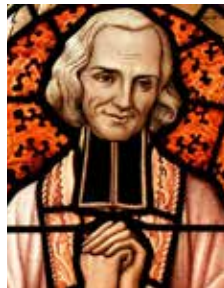

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John Vianney (1786–1859)

Feast Day: August 4

Saint John Vianney, also known as the Curé of Ars, is the patron saint of parish priests and a model of pastoral charity. Born in France during the turbulent years of the French Revolution, he struggled academically but persevered in his vocation to the priesthood.



Assigned to the small rural parish of Ars, he transformed the village through his holiness, preaching, and tireless devotion to the confessional—sometimes spending up to 16 hours a day hearing confessions. His deep love for the Eucharist and Our Lady was central to his priestly life.

John Vianney's humility, simplicity, and sacrificial love drew tens of thousands of pilgrims during his lifetime. He once said, "The priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus."

Canonized in 1925, he remains a powerful intercessor for priests and all who seek God's mercy.

2025 Jubilee Year Pilgrims of Hope



The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has designated four pilgrimage sites for the Jubilee Year 2025, including our own Cathedral of St. Joseph!

The other sites are the Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart (Charleston), St. Patrick Church (Weston), and St. Joseph Parish (Martinsburg).

From now until December 28, 2025, the faithful are invited to visit these locations to obtain a Jubilee Indulgence, as called for by Pope Francis. To receive this special grace, pilgrims must:

Make a brief pilgrimage to one of the designated sites as a sign of conversion and hope.

Pray—by participating in Holy Mass, Liturgy of the Hours, the Stations of the Cross, or the Rosary.

Confess—receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 20 days before or after the pilgrimage.

Receive Holy Communion, reflecting on the hope God gives.

Pray for the Holy Father and his intentions, with the Our Father and Hail Mary recommended.

A Plenary Indulgence may be applied to oneself or a soul in purgatory and can be obtained once per day.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Transfiguration

Question:

What is the significance of the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord?

Answer:

The Feast of the Transfiguration, celebrated on August 6, commemorates the moment when Jesus revealed His divine glory to three of His apostles—Peter, James, and John—on Mount Tabor. This event, recorded in the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke, reveals the true nature of Jesus as both fully human and fully divine. The Transfiguration is a pivotal moment in the Gospels because it strengthens the disciples' faith, preparing them for the trials they will face, especially leading up to Christ's Passion and Death.

The feast also emphasizes the power of God's presence in Jesus Christ, showing that He is the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets. As Moses and Elijah appear beside Jesus during the Transfiguration, it signifies that Jesus is the continuation and completion of the Old Testament revelations. For Catholics, this feast is a reminder of the glory of Christ and the promise of eternal life with Him, encouraging us to live our lives in the light of His divine radiance.

This feast day is an opportunity for all of us to reflect on how we can be transfigured by God's grace. It calls us to seek deeper intimacy with Christ and live in His light, allowing His glory to shine through our actions and faith. Just as the apostles were transformed by witnessing Christ's divine glory, we are invited to be transformed in our relationship with Him.
