RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Today, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday, a day of joyful anticipation in the middle of the Advent season. The name *Gaudete* comes from the Latin word meaning "rejoice," and it reminds us that the coming of the Lord is very near. This joy is reflected in the rose-colored vestments and the lighting of the rose candle on the Advent wreath.

In the Responsorial Psalm, we proclaim: "*Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.*" As Christians, we recognize this prophecy of Isaiah fulfilled in Jesus Christ. But even more profoundly, as Catholics, we experience its reality in the Eucharist. At every Mass, Christ, the "great and Holy One of Israel," is truly among us—body, blood, soul, and divinity. This presence is the deepest reason for our joy, for in the Eucharist, God comes to dwell not only near us but within us.

Gaudete Sunday invites us to reflect on this wondrous gift. The joy we are called to share is not fleeting or based on worldly circumstances. It is rooted in the abiding presence of Christ among His people. As we prepare to welcome Christ anew at Christmas, let us draw near to Him in the Eucharist, where our faith is strengthened, our hearts are consoled, and our joy is renewed.

May this Sunday of rejoicing inspire us to approach the altar with gratitude and awe, and may we share this joy with those who long to know the love of God.

MONTH 3 – Developing Baby – “I can suck my thumb!”
Your baby is quite active in the womb now - although his mother won't feel him for another couple of months. If his mother's womb had a window, you could watch your spiritually adopted baby squint, swallow and move his tongue. He can make a tight fist if you touch his palm. He is breathing amniotic fluid which continues until birth, although he obtains the oxygen his body needs through the umbilical cord. The baby you are praying for weighs one ounce. Early this month – at just 9 weeks – he began to suck his thumb.

December: For pilgrims of hope

We pray that this Jubilee Year strengthen our faith, helping us to recognize the Risen Christ in our daily lives, and that it may transform us into pilgrims of Christian hope.

Heavenly Father, as we rejoice in the nearness of Your Son, fill our hearts with His light and peace, that we may proclaim His coming with joy. Amen.

The "O" Antiphons

Each year on December 17, the Church begins a series of seven short verses sung before the Magnificat during Evening Prayer, on the seven days before the vigil of Christmas. They each begin with the exclamation "O" and are therefore called the "O Antiphons." The antiphons were composed in the seventh or eighth century when monks put together texts from the Old Testament which looked forward to the coming of our salvation. The first letter of the Messianic titles: Emmanuel, Rex, Oriens, Clavis, Radix, Adonai, Sapientia—all spell out Latin words *ERO CRAS*, meaning, "Tomorrow, I will come."

December 17 - O Wisdom of our God Most High, guiding creation with power and love: come to teach us the path of knowledge!

December 18 - O Leader of the House of Israel, giver of the Law to Moses on Sinai: come to rescue us with your mighty power!

December 19 - O Root of Jesse's stem, sign of God's love for all his people: come to save us without delay!

December 20 - O Key of David, opening the gates of God's eternal Kingdom: come and free the prisoners of darkness!

December 21 - O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice: come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

December 22 - O King of all nations and keystone of the Church: come and save man, whom you formed from the dust!

December 23 - O Emmanuel, our King and Giver of Law: come to save us, Lord our God!



Month of the Divine Infancy

The month of December is traditionally dedicated to the Divine Infancy of Jesus Christ. This month, let the paradox of Christ's birth and childhood strike us anew. Let us pray with Mary in the words of an ancient hymn by Saint Ephrem the Syrian: "I am your Mother but I will give honor to you. I have engendered you, but you are older than I am. I have carried you in my womb, but you sustain me on my feet. You have been born of me like a little one, but you are as strong as a giant. The height of the heavens are filled with your majesty, and yet my womb has not been too small for you."

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Decorating for Christmas

Question:

Why do some churches decorate for Christmas late in Advent?

Answer:

The timing of Christmas decorations in many churches highlights the spiritual significance of Advent. Advent is a season of waiting, anticipation, and preparation for the celebration of Christ's birth. It is distinct from the Christmas season, which begins on December 25 and lasts until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord in January.

During Advent, the Church encourages a focus on spiritual preparation, reflected in the simplicity of decorations like the Advent wreath and the use of purple. Many parishes wait until just before Christmas to decorate fully, emphasizing the transition from Advent to Christmas. This delay builds anticipation for the feast and aligns with the liturgical rhythm, where Christmas is celebrated as a season of joy, not just a single day.

This tradition can also inspire individuals and families to embrace Advent as a time of patient waiting and to fully immerse themselves in the joy of the Christmas season once it arrives, rather than rushing to take down decorations immediately after December 25. It's a reminder that Christmas begins, rather than ends, on Christmas Day.

Bishop Brennan Releases New Pastoral Letter on Evangelization

Angel Tree Project

We are filled with gratitude for the incredible generosity of our Cathedral family! Thanks to your kindness, the gifts from this year's Angel Tree project were delivered to Catholic Charities this past week, bringing joy and hope to those in need this Christmas season. Your support truly embodies the spirit of Christ's love in action. Let us continue to pray for the families and individuals who will receive these gifts, that they may feel the warmth of God's love during this holy season!

Cathedral Maintenance Fund

Our beautiful Cathedral, rich in history and faith, is in need of some important repairs and upgrades to preserve its integrity for future generations. The Diocesan Office of Buildings and Properties and our Cathedral Finance Council has identified three critical maintenance projects that require attention:

Roof Repairs: A significant leak in the roof, especially problematic during strong winds, threatens further interior damage. The estimated repair is around \$145,000.

Wall Repairs: Cracked limestone near one of the transept windows needs urgent attention to prevent further deterioration. The estimated cost for this repair is \$9,680.

HVAC System Replacement: Our air conditioning system is aging, and the refrigerant it uses is now obsolete. The air handlers are nearing the end of their lifespan, with an estimated replacement cost of approximately \$250,000.
