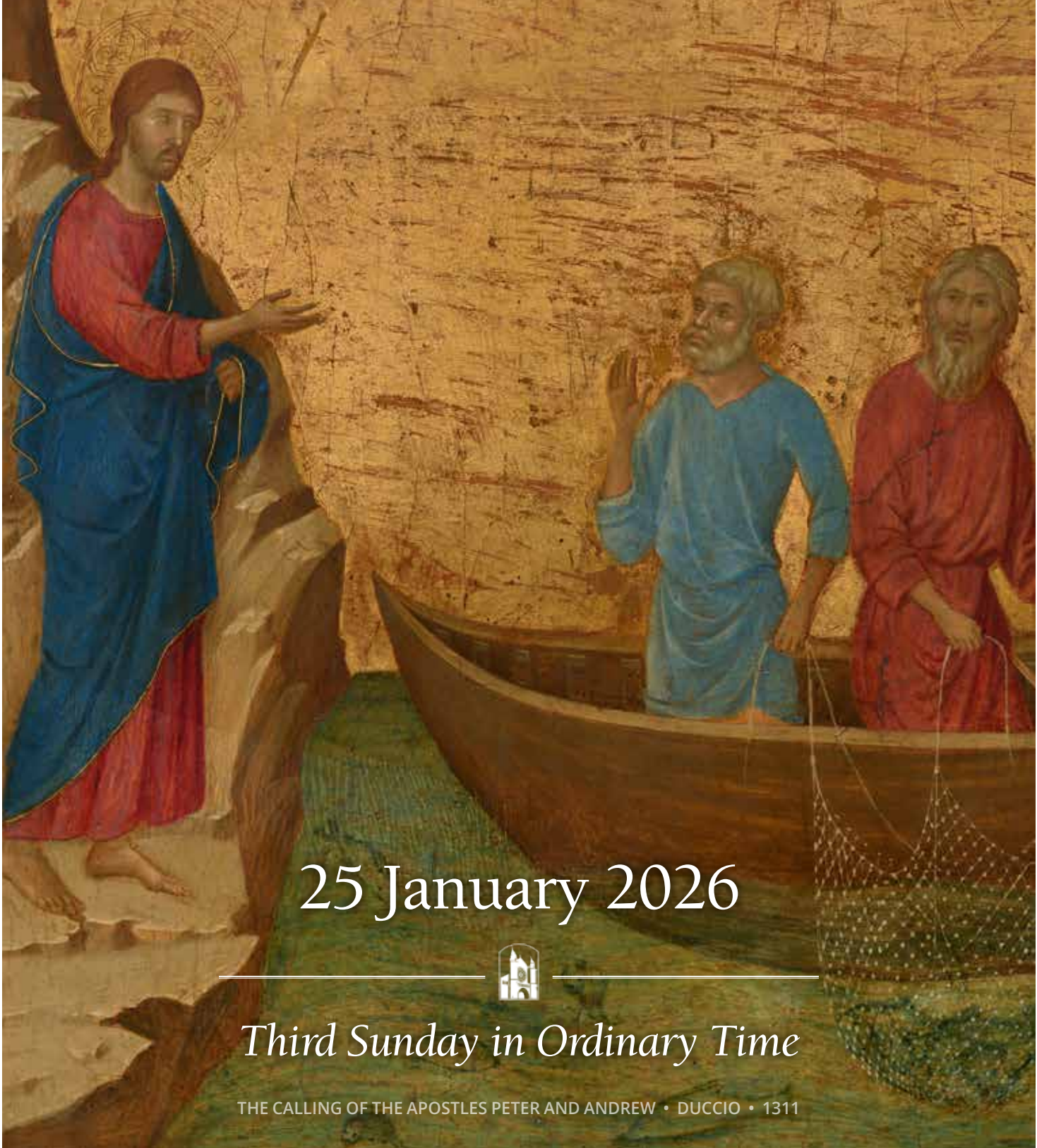

The Word of God is not only a book to be read. It is the living voice of God speaking to His people today. Through the Scriptures, the Lord teaches us, guides us, and strengthens us in faith.

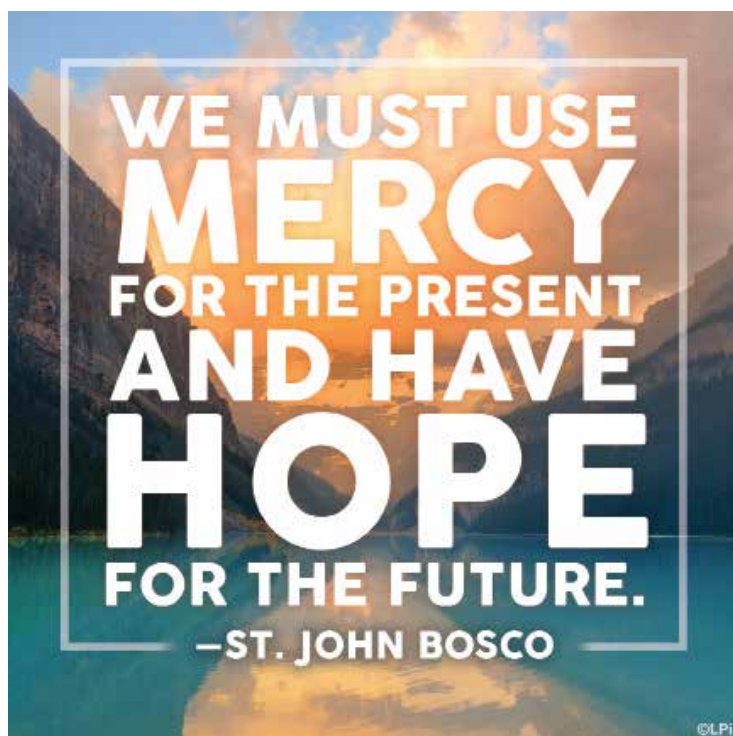
In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus call His first disciples and say, "Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." Rooted in the Word

Why Sacred Scripture Must Shape Our Catholic Life

At the heart of our Catholic faith is a God who speaks. From the first pages of Genesis to the final vision of Revelation, Sacred Scripture reveals a God who creates, calls, teaches, forgives, and saves. The Bible is not merely a collection of ancient writings. It is the living Word of God, given to guide our lives and draw us into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

To be truly Catholic is to be rooted in the Word. Scripture is not meant to remain on a shelf or be opened only at Mass. It is meant to shape our minds, form our hearts, and direct our choices. When we listen attentively to God's Word, we allow Him to speak into our joys and struggles, our hopes and fears, and our everyday decisions.

The Second Vatican Council beautifully reminds us, "In the sacred books, the Father who is in heaven comes lovingly to meet His children and speaks with them" (*Dei Verbum*, 21). These words reveal the heart of Sacred Scripture. When we open the Bible, we are not simply reading history or poetry. We are entering into a living conversation with God who knows us, loves us, and desires to guide us.

Every Mass places Sacred Scripture at the center of our worship. In the Liturgy of the Word, we hear God speak to us as a community. These readings are not chosen at random. They are part of the Church's wisdom, carefully arranged so that over time we are nourished by the whole story of salvation. When the Scriptures are proclaimed, it is Christ Himself who speaks to His people.

But our encounter with the Word should not end when Mass concludes. God desires to speak to us daily. Even a few minutes with the Scriptures each day can transform our spiritual life. Reading the Gospel, praying with the Psalms, or reflecting on the daily Mass readings



opens our hearts to God's grace and strengthens us for the challenges we face.

Sacred Scripture also forms us as disciples. It teaches us how to love, how to forgive, how to serve, and how to trust. It challenges us when we grow comfortable and encourages us when we grow weary. In a world filled with noise, distraction, and competing voices, the Word of God offers clarity, truth, and peace.

When we root our lives in Scripture, we become more attentive to God's will. We begin to see the world through the eyes of faith. We learn to recognize Christ in the poor, the suffering, and the forgotten. We grow in wisdom and humility, and our faith becomes stronger and more resilient.

As we continue this new year, let us renew our love for Sacred Scripture. Let us open the Bible more often. Let us listen more carefully at Mass. Let us allow God's Word to shape our lives and guide our steps.

May we be a community deeply rooted in the Word, formed by its truth, and strengthened by its promise. And may the living Word of God always lead us closer to Jesus Christ, who is the Word made flesh.

Throughout the month of January, we give special honor to the Most Holy Name of Jesus. Saint Paul wrote to the Philippians: "At the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:10-11). We hold the name of Jesus in special reverence. The very name of Jesus is a prayer.

A Way to Honor the Holy Name of Jesus

Adopt the pious practice (that used to be more widely practiced and is so meaningful and fitting) of bowing your head whenever you say or hear the name of Jesus (just as we should bow or genuflect before the Real Presence in the tabernacle or make a sign of the cross as we pass a Catholic Church). The Council of Lyons in 1274 stated: "Each should fulfill in himself that which is written for all, that at the Name of Jesus every knee should bow; whenever that glorious Name is recalled, especially during the sacred Mysteries of the Mass, everyone should bow the knees of his heart, which he can do even by a bow of his head." This devotion also helps to make amends for blasphemous use of the Holy Name.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint John Bosco (1818-1888)

Feast Day: January 31

Saint John Bosco, also known as Don Bosco, dedicated his life to the education and care of young people, especially the poor and abandoned. Born in Italy, he felt called to the priesthood from an early age and became known for his cheerful spirit and deep faith.



With a heart for helping youth, he founded the Salesian Society, emphasizing education, spiritual formation, and vocational training rooted in kindness and love. Don Bosco believed in guiding young people with reason, religion, and loving relationships.

He also had a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, especially under the title of Help of Christians. St. John Bosco, pray for us!

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:
Love as a Theological Virtue

Question:

I've heard that love is a theological virtue. What does that mean?

Answer:

Charles Shultz, the creator of the Peanuts comics wrote, "I love mankind ... it's people I can't stand!" This good humored comment gets at an important truth. St. John wrote a very strong statement in one of his letters: "If anyone says 'I love God,' but hates his brother, he is a liar; for whoever does not love a brother whom he has seen cannot love God whom he has not seen" (1 John 4:20). How often do we say "I love the homeless," but ignore the parish food drive? Or insist on the importance of respecting others, but don't bother to say hello to our cashier? If we can't love an individual person, we might not love people like we think, and we certainly need to work on our love for God.

Love is "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for His own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" (CCC 1822). God knows acts of love of Him and others isn't always easy. So He invites us to pray for the grace to do it. The virtue of love gives us the grace and strength we need to offer our lives to God and love people in our lives, especially those who are difficult to respect, tolerate, and care for. Real love, of course, is risky. Real love wills the good of the other when we just want good for ourselves. Real love gets up on the cross when we'd prefer to take a nap in Gethsemane. Real love changes things.
