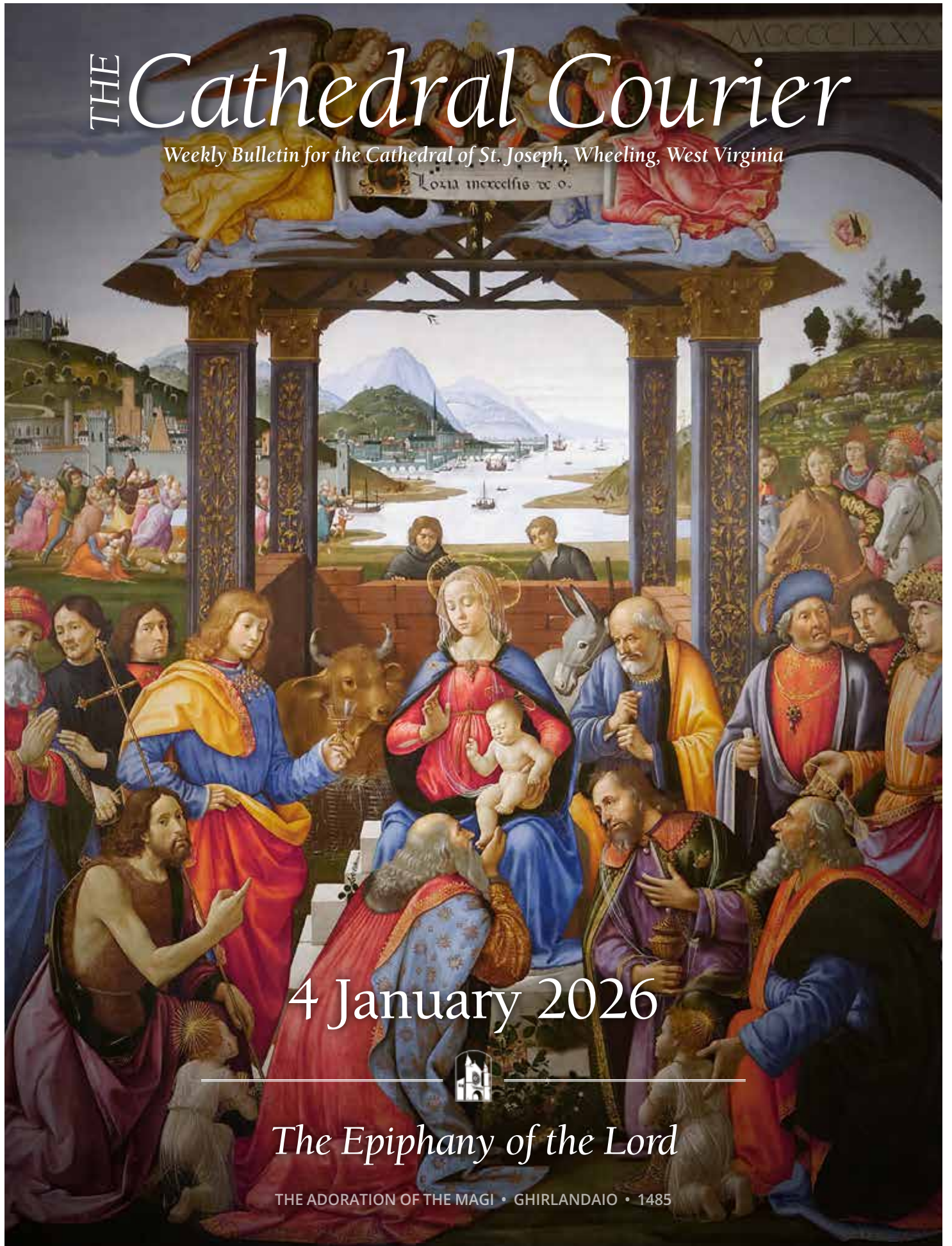

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

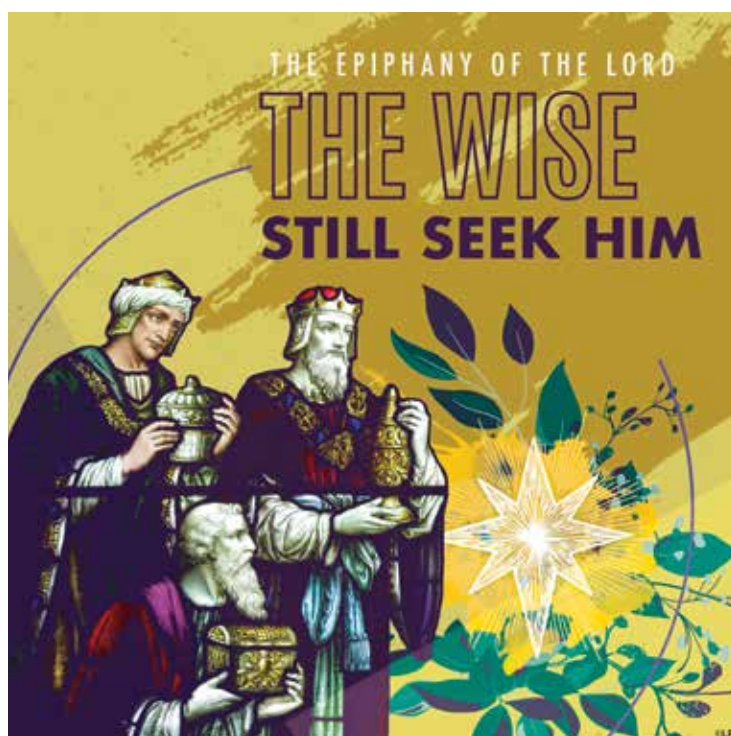
Today we celebrate the Epiphany of the Lord, the great feast when Christ is revealed to the nations. The Magi followed the star with faith and perseverance until it led them to the Child Jesus. When they found Him, they bowed down and offered their gifts. The Epiphany reminds us that Jesus is not only for one people, but for all. He is the light who shines in the darkness and calls every heart to seek Him.


We are also a few days into the New Year, 2026. Many people make resolutions at this time, but often they do not last. Instead of resolutions that fade quickly, I encourage you to make a simple and lasting commitment: to grow deeper in faith and love for Jesus Christ. Epiphany Home Blessing

For centuries, the Christmas season has been a time when Christians have their homes blessed.

A traditional way of doing this is by inscribing above the entrance door with blessed chalk:

20+C+M+B+26

The numbers represent the new year (2026). The letters represent both the names of the Magi (Caspar, Melchoir, and Bathasar) and the phrase "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," which is Latin for "May Christ Bless the House."

Epiphany Blessing

The traditional Epiphany Blessing of Water and Salt recalls Christ's manifestation as Light to the nations and asks God's protection and blessing upon our homes and families in the year ahead. Blessed water and salt are sacramentals, used prayerfully as signs of faith, God's grace, and His safeguarding presence in daily life.

When was the last time you invited someone to Mass?

Each one of us has a responsibility to evangelize - to share the Good News of Jesus Christ. How can we reach out to our friends, family members, and those we work with who are not practicing their faith? **Consider inviting them to join you for Mass this new year.** Pray that the peace and joy of the Christ Child may enlighten their hearts and minds to accept His grace in their lives.

Maintenance & Restoration Update

We are pleased to share that several much-needed maintenance and repair projects are now underway at the Cathedral. Two sections of the roof over the Upper Sanctuary, which had been causing the most interior damage, have been completed. Additional exterior work is scheduled to begin on January 5, weather permitting, with a lift on site to address areas in need of attention.

Looking ahead, during the second week of January, interior scaffolding will be installed to support important restoration work inside the Cathedral. This will include cleaning the four main columns that support the dome, restoration of the Apse mural and work in both transepts. Further plaster repair and painting of the men's and women's restrooms is planned for the spring. We are grateful for your patience and generous support as we care for this sacred space entrusted to us.

We Have Seen His Star Recognizing Christ and Responding in Faith

The Epiphany of the Lord proclaims a simple yet powerful truth: Christ has been revealed. The Magi, guided by a star, recognized the sign God placed before them and set out on a journey that would change their lives. When they finally encountered the Child, Scripture tells us that “they prostrated themselves and did him homage.” Seeing led to seeking, and seeking led to worship.



Lord not only in church, but wherever He chooses to reveal Himself.

The Epiphany invites us to ask a personal and challenging question: Where do we see Christ today? The Magi recognized Him not in power or wealth, but in a child held in His mother’s arms. Their faith teaches us that God still reveals Himself in humble and unexpected ways, if we are willing to look with eyes of faith.

We see Christ as well in the ordinary moments of daily life. He is present in families striving to love one another, in acts of forgiveness quietly offered, in patience shown amid difficulty, and in generosity that asks for nothing in return. These moments may not shine as brightly as a star, but they reveal the same Lord to those attentive enough to notice.

Most profoundly, we see Christ in the Holy Eucharist. At every Mass, the same Jesus who was laid in the manger is made present on the altar, truly and substantially present, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. What appeared hidden in Bethlehem is now hidden under the signs of bread and wine. Faith allows us to recognize what the senses alone cannot. Like the Magi, we are invited to kneel, adore, and offer our lives in response.

The Magi also teach us that recognizing Christ demands a response. After encountering the Lord, they “returned to their country by another way.” The Epiphany is not only about seeing, but about being changed. When we truly recognize Christ, in the Eucharist and in one another, we cannot remain the same. Our paths, priorities, and hearts are redirected.

The Epiphany also reminds us that Christ is revealed beyond the altar. Jesus Himself tells us that whatever we do for the least of our brothers and sisters, we do for Him. We see Christ in the poor, the sick, the lonely, the stranger, and the imprisoned. He is present in the faces of those who suffer, waiting not only to be recognized, but to be loved.

The star that led the Magi still shines. It shines in the light of faith, in the sacraments of the Church, and in the lives of those who reflect Christ’s love to the world. The Epiphany calls us to look again, to recognize the Lord in our midst, and to follow where He leads.

We also see Christ in the life of the Church gathered in worship. He is present in the proclaimed Word, in the assembly united in prayer, and in the ministry of the priest who acts in the person of Christ. These sacred encounters, repeated week after week, train our hearts to recognize the

May this feast renew our vision, that we may truly say with joy and conviction: we have seen His star, and we have found Christ among us.

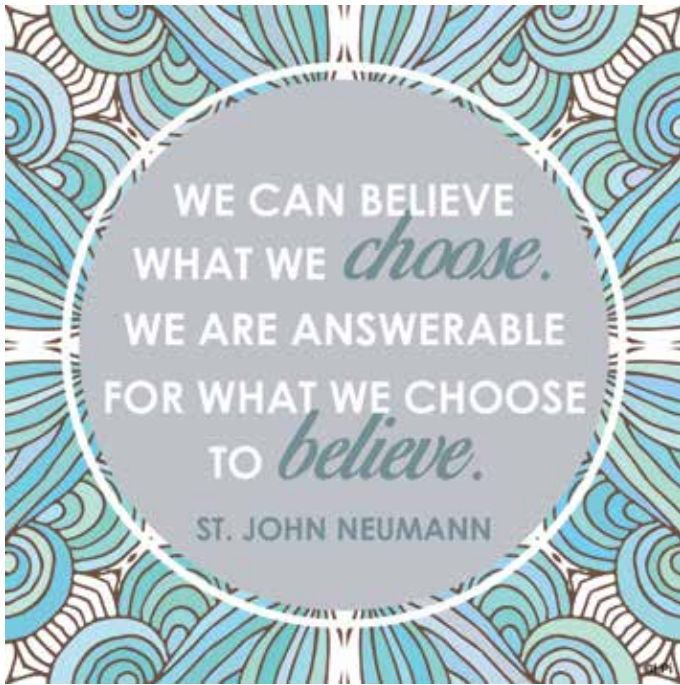

LIVING OUR FAITH



Throughout the month of January, we give special honor to the Most Holy Name of Jesus. Saint Paul wrote to the Philippians: "At the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father" (Philippians 2:10-11). We hold the name of Jesus in special reverence. The very name of Jesus is a prayer.

A Way to Honor the Holy Name of Jesus

Adopt the pious practice (that used to be more widely practiced and is so meaningful and fitting) of bowing your head whenever you say or hear the name of Jesus (just as we should bow or genuflect before the Real Presence in the tabernacle or make a sign of the cross as we pass a Catholic Church). The Council of Lyons in 1274 stated: "Each should fulfill in himself that which is written for all, that at the Name of Jesus every knee should bow; whenever that glorious Name is recalled, especially during the sacred Mysteries of the Mass, everyone should bow the knees of his heart, which he can do even by a bow of his head." This devotion also helps to make amends for blasphemous use of the Holy Name.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint André Bessette (1845–1937)

Feast Day: January 6

Saint André Bessette, a humble Holy Cross brother and the first Canadian-born male saint, was deeply devoted to St. Joseph. Born in Quebec and orphaned young, André faced poor health and little education but lived a life of simple faith and perseverance.



As a porter at Notre Dame College in Montreal, he became known for his compassion and prayers, often invoking St. Joseph's intercession. Brother André's devotion to St. Joseph inspired him to dream of building a shrine in his honor. With tireless effort and the support of countless pilgrims, he oversaw the construction of what is now Saint Joseph's Oratory in Montreal, a magnificent basilica and renowned pilgrimage site. He is credited with many healings through his prayers and St. Joseph's intercession.

Let us be inspired by his life to trust in God and seek holiness in the small acts of daily life. *St. André Bessette, pray for us!*

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Three Wise Men

Question:

Magi, Three Kings, Three Wise Men...who were they?

Answer:

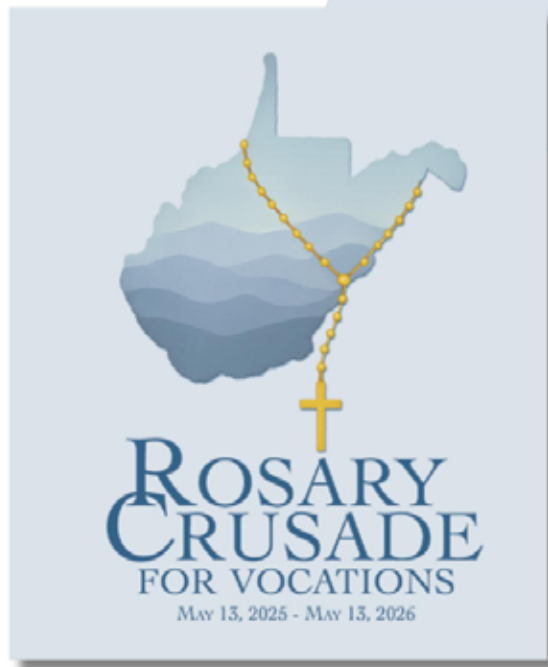
We sing songs, give gifts, and move three mysterious men into our manger scenes. There's a rich heritage in the Catholic Church of celebrating the magi, but their origins are steeped in mystery. The original Greek calls these men *magoi*. The word is translated elsewhere in Scripture to mean "magician," but a similar word was used in ancient history to describe an entirely different set of people altogether. In what is now modern-day Iran, the ruling empire had a wealthy priestly caste known as the Magi. At the time of Christ, the Magi formed one of the ruling councils of the Parthian Empire. These priests interpreted dreams and read the stars to anticipate major events that could affect the fortunes of the empire.

We're not exactly sure where the magi of the Gospels traveled from. Matthew simply says "the east." History tells us that the ancient regions of Persia, Assyria, and Babylon all had a magi priesthood at the time of Christ. Whichever region they hailed from, they likely traveled over one thousand miles over the course of several months to arrive at the Holy Family. Unfortunately for the classic song, there is no concrete evidence these men were themselves kings, though they did bear gifts "from afar" at the prompting of their astronomical calculations.
