## RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Today we hear a very familiar and powerful parable from our Lord - the story of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37). A man was beaten and left for dead. Two people passed him by, but one, someone considered an outsider, stopped, had compassion, and cared for him. Jesus tells us, "Go and do likewise."

Sometimes, we are tempted to look away or pretend we don't see when someone is hurting. But the Christian way is the way of mercy. The Lord calls us not only to believe with our words, but to love with our actions. If we want to inherit eternal life, we must learn to see our neighbor in every person we meet, especially those in need.

Summer can be a season of rest and travel, but it's also a chance to grow in quiet faithfulness, especially in how we respond to the needs of those around us. Have we made time to pray, to come to Sunday Mass, and to care for the "wounded" on the roadside of our own lives?

This coming Wednesday, July 16, is the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. We will have a special Mass at 7:00 p.m. here at the Cathedral. During the Mass, all who are present will have the chance to be invested with the Brown Scapular of Our Lady. This scapular is a sign of our love for Mary and of our desire to follow Jesus with a faithful and simple heart. I warmly invite you and your family to come.

Finally, thank you to all who remembered me with your prayers, kind wishes, and cards to celebrate my birthday. Your thoughtfulness means a great deal.

May Our Lady of Mount Carmel guide us to her Son. And may we have the grace to live each day with compassion, as good neighbors to all.

## Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Mass with Brown Scapular Enrollment

Join us on Wednesday, July 16 at 7:00 p.m. for a special evening Mass in honor of the Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. During the Mass, those in attendance will have the opportunity to be enrolled in the Confraternity of the Brown Scapular and invested with the Scapular.



The Feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel memorializes the apparition of the Blessed Virgin Mary to St. Simon Stock, a Carmelite priest, and her gift to him of the "Brown Scapular" on July 16, 1251. "Take, beloved son," she said, "this Scapular of your order as a badge of my confraternity and for you and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant." The Carmelites immediately began to wear this Scapular as part of their regular habit, and very soon many non-Carmelites also began to wear it—usually in a smaller form of two small pieces of cloth bound by two strings, worn around the neck, hanging down in front and back.

From the beginning, it was understood that, in order to participate in Our Lady's promises, the wearer of the Scapular must be officially associated with the Carmelite Order. So, the Carmelites established the "Confraternity of the Blessed Virgin of Mount Carmel," which any Catholic may be enrolled in through a short ceremony conducted by a priest. Even so, the Scapular is in no way a "good luck charm." As St. John Paul II wrote, it is a sign that evokes "the awareness that devotion to her cannot be limited to prayers and tributes in her honor on certain occasions, but must become a 'habit,' that is, a permanent orientation of one's own Christian conduct, woven of prayer and interior life, through frequent reception of the sacraments, and the concrete practice of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy."

## Clothed in Her Mantle

### Our Lady of Mount Carmel and the Brown Scapular

Each year on July 16, the Church celebrates the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, recalling the special relationship between the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Carmelite Order. This devotion traces its origins to a powerful moment in history. According to tradition, on July 16, 1251, the Blessed Mother appeared to St. Simon Stock, the Prior General of the Carmelites, who at the time were facing criticism and uncertainty about their future.

Mary handed St. Simon a brown scapular, a simple piece of cloth worn over the shoulders, and spoke these comforting words: "This will be a privilege for you and for all Carmelites, that he who dies in this (scapular) will not suffer eternal fire."

This promise of salvation is not a magical assurance, but a maternal expression of Mary's desire to bring her children safely home to Christ. The scapular is not a religious trinket or token of superstition. It is a sign of commitment to live as a faithful disciple of Jesus under the protection and guidance of His Mother. It is a "garment of grace," reminding us that Mary wraps us in her love and continually intercedes for us.

At the time of the apparition, the Carmelites were struggling. Many questioned their way of life and whether their Order would survive. But Mary's intervention through the gift of the scapular became a source of strength and renewal. The Order not only endured but grew and spread devotion to Our Lady around the world.

One of the most powerful modern witnesses to this devotion was Pope St.

John Paul II. He wore the Brown Scapular from his youth and never removed it, even during the darkest moments of his life. On May 13, 1981, after being shot in an assassination attempt, he was taken into surgery at Rome's Gemelli Hospital still wearing the scapular. As doctors prepared him for surgery, he told them, "Don't take off the scapular." They honored his request, and by God's grace, he survived.

In a 2001 message to the Carmelite family marking the 750th anniversary of the scapular, Pope John Paul II offered profound insight into its meaning:



"Two truths are evoked by the sign of the Scapular: On one hand, the constant protection of the Blessed Virgin, not only on life's journey, but also at the moment of passing into eternal glory. On the other, the awareness that devotion to her must become a 'habit,' a permanent orientation of one's Christian conduct, woven of prayer

and interior life, through frequent reception of the sacraments and the concrete practice of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy."

The Scapular is a sign of a covenant, a spiritual bond between Mary and the faithful. It calls us to live a life of prayer, trust, and charity in union with Christ and in the loving care of His Mother.

As we celebrate this feast, may we renew our devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel and entrust ourselves to her guidance. For those who have not yet been enrolled in the Brown Scapular, consider receiving this beautiful gift - a sign of belonging to Mary and her promise to lead us closer to Jesus.

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Bonaventure (c. 1217–1274)

*Feast Day: June 15*

Saint Bonaventure, known as the "Seraphic Doctor," was a Franciscan friar, theologian, and Doctor of the Church. Born in Italy, he joined the Franciscans and became known for both his brilliant intellect and deep holiness.



A contemporary of Saint Thomas Aquinas, Bonaventure studied at the University of Paris and later served as Minister General of the Franciscans, guiding the Order with wisdom and humility. His writings beautifully blend theology and devotion, emphasizing that love is greater than knowledge.

Named a cardinal by Pope Gregory X, he died in 1274 while helping at the Second Council of Lyon. Canonized in 1482, he remains a model of learning in the service of God.

# 2025 Jubilee Year Pilgrims of Hope



**The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has designated four pilgrimage sites for the Jubilee Year 2025, including our own Cathedral of St. Joseph!**

The other sites are the Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart (Charleston), St. Patrick Church (Weston), and St. Joseph Parish (Martinsburg).

From now until December 28, 2025, the faithful are invited to visit these locations to obtain a Jubilee Indulgence, as called for by Pope Francis. To receive this special grace, pilgrims must:

**Make a brief pilgrimage** to one of the designated sites as a sign of conversion and hope.

**Pray**—by participating in Holy Mass, Liturgy of the Hours, the Stations of the Cross, or the Rosary.

**Confess**—receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 20 days before or after the pilgrimage.

**Receive Holy Communion**, reflecting on the hope God gives.

**Pray for the Holy Father and his intentions**, with the Our Father and Hail Mary recommended.

A Plenary Indulgence may be applied to oneself or a soul in purgatory and can be obtained once per day.

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Catholic Life Explained:

#### *Holy Communion*

#### **Question:**

How can I help bring my child back to Mass?

#### **Answer:**

This is a question many faithful parents ask with heavy hearts. When a child stops attending Mass—whether as a teenager, a college student, or an adult—it can feel like a deeply personal loss. But you're not alone, and most importantly, God is not done with your child.

The first and most powerful thing you can do is pray. Never underestimate the quiet work of grace in the soul of someone you love. Offer Rosaries, make holy hours, and entrust your child daily to the Blessed Mother. Ask her to wrap them in her mantle and bring them back to her Son.

But prayer must also be accompanied by patient love. Avoid guilt trips or arguments. A heart doesn't usually return to the Church through force, it returns through mercy. Let your child know that your love for them is unconditional, and that your faith is not just something you believe, but Someone you love. Let them see that going to Mass is not a chore for you but a source of peace, strength, and joy.

When the time feels right, invite them. A simple, sincere invitation, "Would you come to Mass with me this Sunday?" can be a gentle nudge from the Holy Spirit. You might be surprised how far a kind word or shared moment can go. Sometimes a warm breakfast after Mass or a walk together can make that invitation feel more like a family tradition than a religious obligation.

Above all, trust in God's timing. Many saints strayed before they found their way back. St. Monica prayed for years for her son Augustine before he became not only a Christian, but one of the Church's greatest saints. Your job isn't to force the return—it's to keep the door open and the light on.

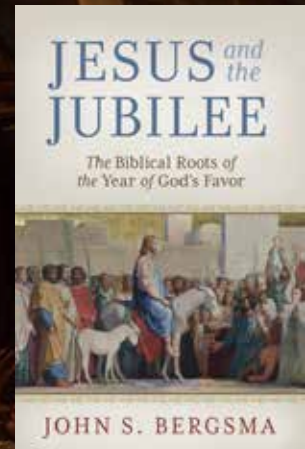
