RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

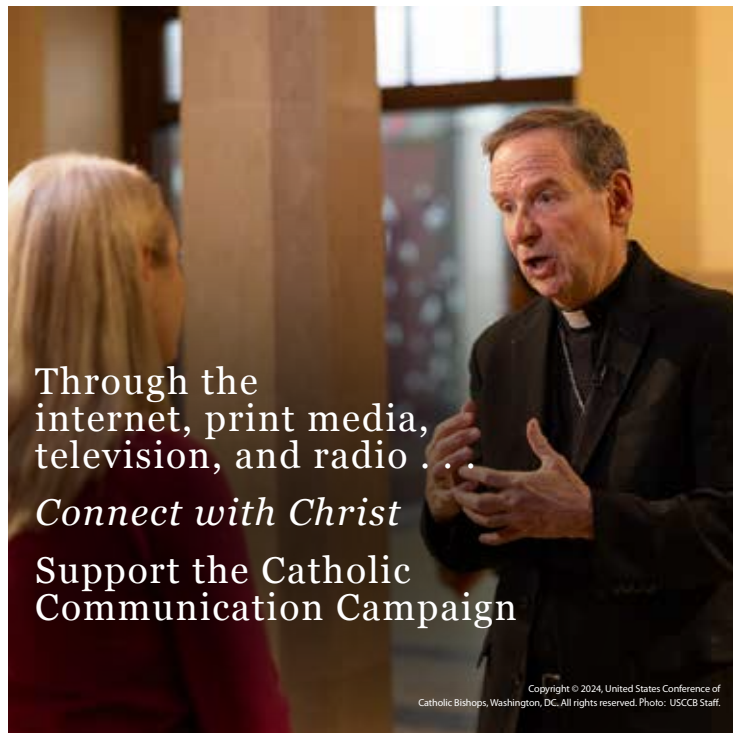
In today's Gospel, we are welcomed into the home of Martha and Mary, two sisters who loved the Lord deeply (Luke 10:38-42). Martha is busy with the tasks of hospitality - important work! - while Mary simply sits at the feet of Jesus and listens to Him. When Martha expresses her frustration, Jesus gently says, "Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

This Gospel is not about choosing between prayer and service, but about putting things in the right order. Both Martha and Mary love Jesus, but Mary first listens to Him. From that listening comes the strength and peace to serve well. We, too, must make time to sit at the feet of the Lord in silence and prayer. In our busy world, this is not easy—but it is necessary if we are to live our faith with joy and clarity.

Summer offers moments of rest and renewal. Have we used some of that time to grow closer to Jesus? Have we opened our hearts in prayer or spent time with His Word? May we not be so "anxious and worried about many things" that we forget the one thing necessary: to be with Christ and listen to His voice.

Let us keep one another in prayer.

Celebrating 175 Years of Faith and Service: The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston

On July 19, 2025, the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston will commemorate a historic milestone—its 175th anniversary. Established by Pope Pius IX in 1850, the Diocese of Wheeling was the first Catholic diocese in what is now the state of West Virginia. As we celebrate this remarkable anniversary, we reflect on the faith, perseverance, and dedication that have defined the diocese throughout its history.

A Humble Beginning

The diocese's story began with Bishop Richard Vincent Whelan, who was appointed as its first bishop in 1850. Bishop Whelan recognized the growing Catholic population in the region and worked tirelessly to establish a vibrant Catholic presence. One of his first major accomplishments was the founding of Wheeling Hospital in the same year, marking the beginning of a long-standing commitment to healthcare and service in the region. This early foundation has influenced the development of Catholic institutions and ministries that continue to serve the people of West Virginia today.

Growth and Transformation

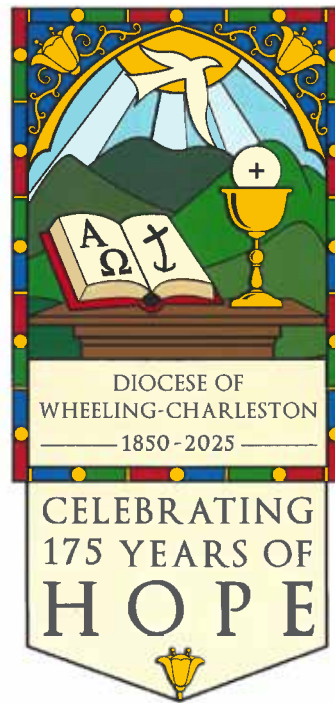
Over the years, the diocese expanded its reach and influence. In 1974, the diocese was realigned to encompass the entire state of West Virginia, and it was renamed the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston. We pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life, especially from among the people of our parish.

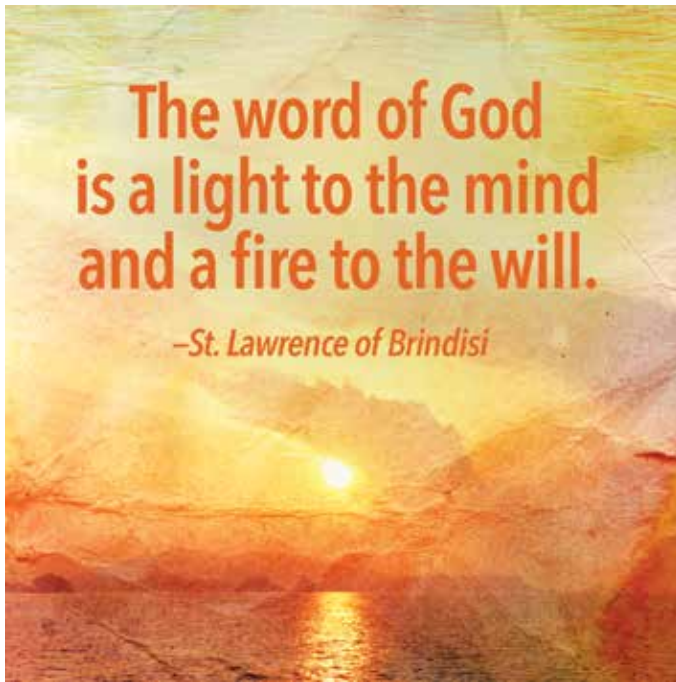

The month of July is traditionally dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus. The feast of the Precious Blood of our Lord was instituted in 1849 by Pius IX, but the devotion is as old as Christianity. The early Fathers say that the Church was born from the pierced side of Christ, and that the sacraments were brought forth through His Blood.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Bridget (c. 1303–1373)

Feast Day: July 23

Saint Bridget of Sweden was a wife, mother, mystic, and founder of a religious order, known for her deep prayer life and powerful revelations. Born into a noble family, she was married and had eight children, including Saint Catherine of Sweden. After her husband's death, Bridget devoted herself entirely to Christ and embraced a life of penance and service.



She received many visions of Jesus and Mary, especially focused on the Passion, which she recorded in her Revelations—writings that deeply influenced Christian spirituality. She later founded the Order of the Most Holy Savior, known as the Bridgettines.

Bridget also worked for Church reform and unity, spending her final years in Rome. Canonized in 1391, she is one of the patron saints of Europe.

2025 Jubilee Year Pilgrims of Hope



The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston has designated four pilgrimage sites for the Jubilee Year 2025, including our own Cathedral of St. Joseph!

The other sites are the Basilica of the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart (Charleston), St. Patrick Church (Weston), and St. Joseph Parish (Martinsburg).

From now until December 28, 2025, the faithful are invited to visit these locations to obtain a Jubilee Indulgence, as called for by Pope Francis. To receive this special grace, pilgrims must:

Make a brief pilgrimage to one of the designated sites as a sign of conversion and hope.

Pray—by participating in Holy Mass, Liturgy of the Hours, the Stations of the Cross, or the Rosary.

Confess—receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation within 20 days before or after the pilgrimage.

Receive Holy Communion, reflecting on the hope God gives.

Pray for the Holy Father and his intentions, with the Our Father and Hail Mary recommended.

A Plenary Indulgence may be applied to oneself or a soul in purgatory and can be obtained once per day.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Mary Magdalene

Question:

July 22 is the feast of Mary Magdalene. I've heard a lot of stories about her, but who was she really?

Answer:

Mary Magdalene has been the subject of speculation and scholarship over the last 2,000 years. Mary Magdalene makes her first named appearance in Luke 8:2. She is one of several women following Jesus. Luke specifically mentions that Mary had previously been delivered from demonic possession. Whatever her life looked like before she met Jesus, it wasn't good! Because of this association with being a repentant sinner, Mary Magdalene has been associated with other similar stories in the Gospel, such as the woman caught in adultery or the woman who bathes Jesus' feet with her tears.

Mary Magdalene shows up again by name at the end of the Gospels, when she stands with the Blessed Virgin Mary at the foot of the Cross. Mary is also present in the garden of the resurrection. She is one of the woman who goes to bring spices to Jesus' tomb, where they find the stone rolled away. Mary stays in the garden weeping, believing his body has been stolen. Jesus approaches her and calls her by name, and she becomes the first witness to the resurrection! While many of the details of Mary Magdalene's life have been lost to time, she is an example of powerful conversion, deep faith, and intimate love for Christ.
