RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension, when the Risen Lord, after appearing to His disciples for forty days, was taken up into heaven. As we read in the Gospel of Mark, "The Lord Jesus, after he spoke to them, was taken up into heaven and took his seat at the right hand of God" (Mark 16:19). This moment is not the end of the story, but the beginning of the Church's mission. Jesus entrusts His disciples—and us—with the task of proclaiming the Gospel to all nations. He ascends, not to leave us behind, but to open the way for us and to send the Holy Spirit to guide and strengthen His Church.

As we look forward to Pentecost next Sunday, we prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit. I invite everyone to join us after the 10:30 a.m. Mass for our Pentecost Potluck in the Cathedral courtyard. Pentecost is the birthday of the Church, and this gathering is a wonderful way for us to celebrate as a parish family. Please come, bring a dish to share, and enjoy this time of fellowship and joy as we mark the end of the Easter season together.

Next Sunday, June 8, also marks the beginning of a change in our Sunday morning Mass schedule. The 8:00 a.m. Mass at the Cathedral will now begin at 7:30 a.m. This adjustment allows us to ensure that all three Sunday morning Masses—two at the Cathedral and one at St. Alphonsus—can be celebrated by one priest if there is a weekend when Father Soplinski or I are unavailable. I want to express my sincere thanks in advance for your understanding and patience. This decision was made with care and out of a desire to continue serving all our parish communities as faithfully as possible.

This Sunday also begins the Month of the Sacred Heart, a time to reflect on the deep and abiding love of Jesus for each of us. His Sacred Heart is a sign of His mercy and tenderness. As we continue through June, let us entrust our joys and burdens to the heart of Christ, asking Him to make our own hearts more like His.

May the Ascension strengthen our hope, and may the promise of the Holy Spirit fill us with courage to live as joyful witnesses of the Risen Lord.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus: A Journey into Divine Love

Part 1: The History of the Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

June is traditionally honored as the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During this month, we will offer a series of reflections on the history and importance of the devotion to the Sacred Heart.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is one of the most beloved and widespread devotions in the Catholic Church, and it is deeply rooted in Scripture, the history of the Church, and the personal revelations of Christ to the saints. This devotion, which we will explore over four parts in this series, focuses on the heart of Jesus as a symbol of His boundless love, mercy, and compassion for humanity.



The devotion to the Sacred Heart can be traced back to the early Church, where the image of Christ's heart was often depicted as a symbol of His love for mankind. However, it was in the 12th century that the theological focus on the heart of Christ began to grow. The devotion became particularly prominent in the 17th century, with the mystical visions of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a French Visitation nun. In 1673, Christ revealed to St. Margaret Mary His Sacred Heart and expressed His sorrow over humanity's ingratitude and neglect of His love.

In these visions, Jesus requested that people honor His Sacred Heart through acts of love, reparation, and devotion. He specifically asked for the establishment of the Feast of the Sacred Heart, the practice of receiving Communion on the first Friday of each month, and the consecration of families to His Sacred Heart. Christ's revelations to St. Margaret Mary emphasized the importance of making reparation for sin and responding to His love with deep devotion.

The Sacred Heart devotion was officially recognized by the Church in 1856, when Pope Pius IX established the Feast of the Sacred Heart as a solemnity for the universal Church. This devotion spread rapidly, with people throughout the Catholic world embracing it as a powerful means to encounter Christ's love more deeply.

Over time, the devotion expanded to include many other practices, such as the novena to the Sacred Heart, and a growing emphasis on offering one's heart and life to Christ in reparation for the sins of the world.

As we reflect on the history of the Sacred Heart devotion, we see that it is not only about honoring an image or symbol, but it invites us to embrace a deeper relationship with Christ. His heart is an enduring sign of His great love for us, a love that was poured out on the Cross for our salvation.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Marcellin Champagnat (1789–1840)

Feast Day: June 6

Saint Marcellin Champagnat was a French priest and the founder of the Marist Brothers, a religious congregation dedicated to the Christian education of youth, especially the poor and neglected.

Born during the French Revolution, he entered the seminary and was ordained in 1816. Deeply moved by the ignorance of the faith he witnessed among young people, Marcellin believed that to teach children, one must love them. He founded the Marist Brothers to form young men as teachers who would educate with kindness, humility, and faith.

Despite many challenges, his trust in Mary, whom he called "Our Good Mother," sustained his mission. Today, his work continues in Marist schools around the world.

Canonized in 1999, his feast day is June 6. Saint Marcellin Champagnat, pray for us!



On the Friday following the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Because this solemnity usually falls in June, this month is also known as the "Month of the Sacred Heart." Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is of great antiquity in the Church. It was Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, however, who made this devotion widespread. The great promise of the Sacred Heart is most consoling: the grace of final perseverance and the joy of having Jesus' heart as our sure refuge and infinite ocean of mercy in our last hour. During the month of June, let us ponder Christ's infinite love and meditate upon his suffering for the salvation of the world.

- Start the First Friday Devotion



WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Ascension

Question:

Why did Jesus have to ascend to heaven?

Answer:

After His Resurrection, Jesus remained with His disciples for forty days, appearing to them, teaching them, and preparing them for their mission. But why did He eventually ascend to heaven (cf. Acts 1:9)? The Ascension was not a departure in the ordinary sense, but the completion of His earthly mission and the beginning of His heavenly reign. Jesus did not abandon His followers—instead, He opened the way for the Holy Spirit to be sent and for His presence to be extended throughout the world in a new and powerful way.

By ascending into heaven, Christ took His glorified humanity into the presence of the Father, where He now intercedes for us as our eternal High Priest (cf. Hebrews 7:25). The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that Jesus' Ascension marks the definitive entrance of His humanity into God's heavenly domain (CCC 665), making it possible for us, as members of His Body, to one day share in that same glory. He goes to prepare a place for us (cf. John 14:2), promising that where He is, we may also be.

The Ascension also reminds us of our mission. As the angels told the Apostles, "This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return" (Acts 1:11). Until that day, we are called to be His witnesses, strengthened by the Spirit and guided by the hope of heaven. The Ascension, then, is not an end, but a beginning—the beginning of the Church's mission and our journey as pilgrims of hope toward our true home.
