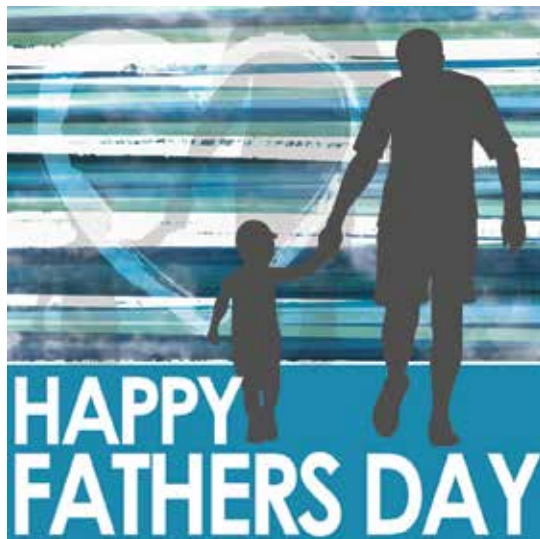

Pilgrim Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to Visit Cathedral

From Wednesday, June 18, through Friday, June 27, the Cathedral of St. Joseph will host the Pilgrim Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

An initiative of the Knights of Columbus, the Pilgrim Icon offers the faithful a special opportunity to reflect on the profound mercy and love of Christ through devotion to His Sacred Heart.



Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly has shared that, as Knights bring these icons across the world to parishes, “they will invite their families — and all families — to consecrate their homes and themselves to the Sacred Heart.” He further noted, “In the Heart of Christ, we see the Heart of the Father. And we ask Our Lord to help us make His Heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what He sees and loves in us.”

This year marks the 350th anniversary of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque’s final revelation from Jesus, in which He revealed His infinite love for humanity. This powerful message sparked the widespread devotion to the Sacred Heart, and its images have since become cherished by Catholics around the world.

The Pilgrim Icon will remain at the Cathedral through the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart on June 27. All are invited to visit, participate in this moment of spiritual renewal, and honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in Your Home

Enthroning the Sacred Heart of Jesus means formally recognizing Jesus as King through an enthronement ceremony. During this ceremony, a family places an image of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor in their home, renews their commitment to be faithful disciples, and consecrates themselves to his Sacred Heart.

Families are invited to participate in the Sacred Heart Enthronement, dedicating their homes and lives to Christ by placing an image of His Sacred Heart in a place of honor. This act symbolizes a commitment to live according to His teachings and embrace His love and mercy.

Packets for the Sacred Heart Enrollment will be available on the table near the Pilgrim Icon in the church. We encourage everyone to participate! Included in the packet a booklet with information and prayers for the enrollment, an image of the Sacred Heart, and a certificate to be completed after the enrollment. 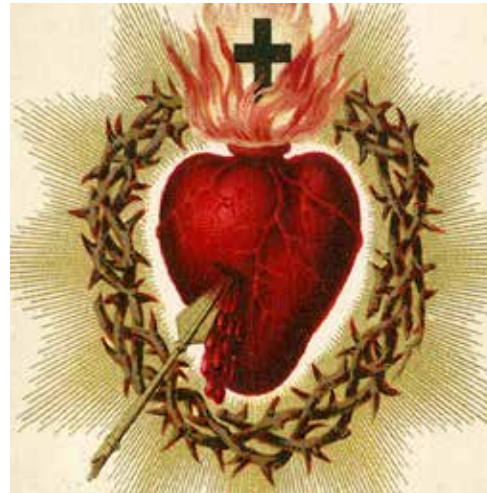

The Sacred Heart of Jesus: A Journey into Divine Love

Part 3: Living the Devotion: Acts of Reparation and Consecration

June is traditionally honored as the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During this month, we will offer a series of reflections on the history and importance of the devotion to the Sacred Heart.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart calls us to live out the love of Christ through specific acts of reparation, consecration, and devotion. These acts help us to grow in our relationship with Christ, to make amends for the wrongs committed against Him, and to offer our lives in service to His love. Through these practices, we not only honor the Sacred Heart but are also transformed by its power.



One of the most important aspects of the devotion is the practice of First Fridays. This devotion involves receiving Holy Communion on the first Friday of each month, in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Jesus promised that those who participate in this devotion would receive special graces, including the grace of final perseverance. The First Friday devotions help us to unite ourselves with the heart of Christ in the Eucharist and to offer our love and gratitude for His sacrifice.

In addition to First Fridays, consecration to the Sacred Heart is a powerful way to live the devotion. Consecration is the act of offering ourselves, our families, and our entire lives to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, asking Him to guide us and protect us. This act of surrender allows Christ to be the center of our lives, shaping our hearts and our actions in accordance with His love. Consecrating ourselves to the Sacred Heart is a way of saying, "Jesus,

I give you my heart, and I trust you to lead me."

Living the devotion also involves incorporating daily prayers and acts of love into our lives. Many people pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart, the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, or the Morning Offering as part of their daily routine. These

prayers help us to stay focused on Christ's love and to align our hearts with His. Whether it's through small sacrifices, acts of kindness, or offering our work to God, the devotion to the Sacred Heart invites us to make every part of our lives an offering of love to Christ.

LIVING OUR FAITH

The Vocation of Fatherhood

Humility, Love, and Trust in God's Plan

The world may simply reduce us to a function, but we are so much more than that. Fathering a child is one prerequisite to parenthood, but that is an impoverished view of "what a man does to become a father, not what a man is as a father." St. Paul tells us "I kneel before the Father from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named" (Eph. 3:14-15) God, as Father, is THE measure of the claim of fatherhood. Fatherhood is a vocation, not just limited to the raising of the child, but fitting within the fabric of God's work of salvation.

I have been blessed with two children, one that has gone before us and one who is growing and learning here with us. Being a father can have challenges. What decisions do we make to help the child that we are responsible for to have the best chance for the future? Do we do this sport or this activity? Are they eating a well-balanced diet? Am I supporting their mother well enough? Am I prioritizing my familial obligations and aspirations while balancing my professional obligations and aspirations? Do we put the Lord at the head of our life and encourage prayer and participation in our faith life? Navigating this can sometimes wear us down and make us feel we are failing as fathers.

We are called to be humble, as Christ taught us in the Beatitudes "Blessed are the poor in spirit." This doesn't mean financial poverty or even spiritual poverty; this means being humble. The Lord wants us to accept that in ourselves we are not enough. We must humble ourselves and call upon, and TRUST, in the Lord when we can't do it on our own. This can seem like a far cry from what the culture had taught us. That being a man means to have it all together and be strong. In our quest to be humble, we find our strength.

The Catechism reminds us that "parents must regard their children as children of God and respect them as human persons" (CCC 2222) We think of the father being the head of the family, and while this is true, we should not take an exaggerated approach to this. We need to be mindful that children aren't things that were created to do our bidding or check some box. They are God's children, and we are blessed to love and care for them. Their vocation in life will be revealed to them and they are just as much part of the work of salvation as we are. We are blessed by God, in more than a command, in His saying "be fruitful and multiply" to our first parents. This is the reflection of God. This is our joining in his creation, in his life-giving role.

Fathers, stay humble, pray often, and remember that our Father loves us. May we be prodigal in God's love for others and for ourselves.

Catholic Life Explained:

Rosaries as Decorations

Question:

I've seen people hang rosaries over the rear-view mirrors in their cars and a few of them wear them around their necks. Is it

Answer:

The practice of hanging a rosary or a religious medal off of the rearview mirror of one's car is a fairly popular custom across many cultures. While there is no particular rule approving or condemning this practice, we should also be mindful of the respect and reverence due to religious objects and devotional items (i.e. sacramentals).

An important point to consider would be the reason why one chooses to place a rosary or religious medal in our cars. Is it a reminder of the protection and intercession of Mary and the saints? Does it encourage us to be mindful of God's presence, even in such a mundane task as driving? Is it an outward expression of our more private devotions?

One advantage of having a rosary or religious medal in our cars is that it can also serve as a reminder to pray when we travel, asking for protection for ourselves and for other motorists or commuters. Certainly, invoking the protection and prayers of the saints is a wonderful practice for families, helping to reinforce our belief in the communion of saints and the care and concern we owe to one another.

Novena to the Sacred Heart for Pope Leo XIV

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NOVENA FOR THE PONTIFICATE AND INTENTIONS OF POPE LEO XIV

This novena marks the conclusion of the jubilee of the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, beginning on the anniversary of Pope Leo's ordination (June 19) and concluding on the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (June 27).

Novena Prayers

I. For the Pontificate of Pope Leo XIV

O my Jesus, you have said: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Behold I knock, I seek and ask that you bless the ministry of Pope Leo XIV and give him the grace to embody Christ's love and wisdom as he shepherds your flock, the Church.

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.

II. For the Holy Father's Prayer Intentions

O my Jesus, you have said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in my name he will give you." Behold, in your name, I ask the Father for the grace that the world might grow in compassion, and that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.

III. For Our Personal Intentions

O my Jesus, you have said: "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." Encouraged by your infallible words I now ask for the grace that *(add your own personal intentions here)*.

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be.

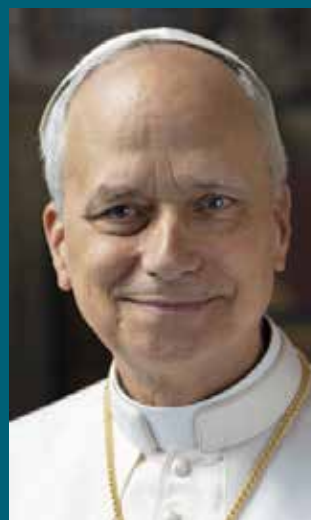
O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.
