RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Today, on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we give special thanks for the wonderful gift of the Holy Eucharist. Jesus, in His great love, did not leave us orphans. He left us His very Body and Blood, not as a symbol, but as a real and living presence. In every Mass, we encounter the Risen Lord, who gives Himself to us so that we may have life in Him.

Following the 10:30 a.m. Mass this Sunday, we will express our love and reverence for the Eucharist through a solemn procession through downtown Wheeling, concluding at St. Alphonsus Church with Benediction. A Eucharistic procession is a public witness to our faith in the Real Presence of Christ and a powerful prayer for our city. As we carry our Lord through the streets, we ask Him to bless our community and draw many more hearts closer to Him.

At the same time, we cannot ignore the devastating flooding that struck our area last weekend. Many of our neighbors have lost homes, belongings, and in some cases, even loved ones. Our hearts are heavy with sorrow for all who are suffering. Please continue to pray for the victims, especially those who have lost so much. In a concrete act of charity, we will be taking up a second collection at all Masses this weekend to support the work of Catholic Charities West Virginia and our own St. Vincent de Paul Society, who are providing urgent help to those affected.

Let us remember that the same Jesus we carry in procession this Sunday is the One who walks with the suffering, the poor, and the brokenhearted. May our reverence for the Eucharist overflow into love and mercy for our neighbors in need.

Pilgrim Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

From Wednesday, June 18, through Friday, June 27, the Cathedral of St. Joseph will host the Pilgrim Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

An initiative of the Knights of Columbus, the Pilgrim Icon offers the faithful a special opportunity to reflect on the profound mercy and love of Christ through devotion to His Sacred Heart.



Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly has shared that, as Knights bring these icons across the world to parishes, “they will invite their families — and all families — to consecrate their homes and themselves to the Sacred Heart.” He further noted, “In the Heart of Christ, we see the Heart of the Father. And we ask Our Lord to help us make His Heart our own, so that we may see and love in others what He sees and loves in us.”

This year marks the 350th anniversary of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque’s final revelation from Jesus, in which He revealed His infinite love for humanity. This powerful message sparked the widespread devotion to the Sacred Heart, and its images have since become cherished by Catholics around the world.

The Pilgrim Icon will remain at the Cathedral through the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart on June 27. All are invited to visit, participate in this moment of spiritual renewal, and honor the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

Enthronement of the Sacred Heart in Your Home

Enthroning the Sacred Heart of Jesus means formally recognizing Jesus as King through an enthronement ceremony. During this ceremony, a family places an image of the Sacred Heart in a place of honor in their home, renews their commitment to be faithful disciples, and consecrates themselves to his Sacred Heart.

Families are invited to participate in the Sacred Heart Enthronement, dedicating their homes and lives to Christ by placing an image of His Sacred Heart in a place of honor. This act symbolizes a commitment to live according to His teachings and embrace His love and mercy.

Packets for the Sacred Heart Enrollment will be available on the table near the Pilgrim Icon in the church. We encourage everyone to participate! Included in the packet is a booklet with information and prayers for the enrollment, an image of the Sacred Heart, and a certificate to be completed after the enrollment. Nominations Now Open for Parish Pastoral Council

The Sacred Heart of Jesus: A Journey into Divine Love

Part 4: The Sacred Heart and the Eucharist

June is traditionally honored as the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During this month, we will offer a series of reflections on the history and importance of the devotion to the Sacred Heart.

One of the most powerful signs of Christ's love in the Eucharist is the Eucharistic Miracle at Lanciano, Italy. In the 8th century, a priest struggling with doubt about the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist witnessed a miracle. During Mass, the bread and wine turned into actual flesh and blood. The flesh was identified as heart tissue and the blood matched

the blood type found in the Shroud of Turin. This miracle was a clear sign that Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, not just as a symbol but as a living reality. The heart of Jesus, poured out for us, is made real in the Eucharist. It is a beautiful reminder of how much He loves us.

When we receive the Eucharist, we encounter that living, beating heart of Christ. It is as if He is giving us a part of Himself, asking us to let His love transform our hearts. The Sacred Heart and the Eucharist remind us

that love is not just something we talk about, it is something we experience. Christ's love is real, it is tangible, and it is meant to change us. Every time we approach the altar, we are invited to enter into His love in a deeply personal way, to let His heart shape our own.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Eucharist go hand in hand. One shows us His love and the other allows us to receive that love in the most intimate way possible. When we think about the Sacred Heart, we think of Jesus' deep, unending love for us, a love that led Him to lay down His life for our salvation. The Eucharist is where this love is most powerfully present.



At the heart of the Eucharist is the reality that Jesus gives us Himself, His Body, His Blood, His Soul, and His Divinity. It is not just a symbol of love; it is Love made present. Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we are invited into the heart of Christ. It is in the Eucharist that we encounter the most profound expression of Jesus' love, His heart beating for us.

In her visions, St. Margaret Mary shared how Jesus revealed His Sacred Heart as a symbol of the incredible love He has for each one of us, a love that seeks to bring us close to Him. He asked for acts of reparation as a way to console His heart, to make up for all the ways people turn away from His love. The Eucharist is the ultimate way we can make reparation because it is through the Eucharist that we remember Christ's love poured out on the Cross. Every time we receive Communion, we unite ourselves to that love and offer our hearts back to Him.

LIVING OUR FAITH

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

The Solemnity of Corpus Christi is a celebration of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Instituted in the 13th century, this feast arose from a deepening awareness of the mystery of the Eucharist and the desire to honor Christ's abiding presence in a public and visible way. Pope Urban IV established the feast for the universal Church in 1264, inspired in part by the Eucharistic miracle of Bolsena, in which a consecrated Host began to bleed during Mass. This miracle reaffirmed the truth of the doctrine of transubstantiation and became a catalyst for devotion.

One of the most beautiful traditions associated with this feast is the Eucharistic procession. During a Corpus Christi procession, the Blessed Sacrament is carried through the streets, often beneath a canopy, accompanied by hymns, incense, and reverent prayer. This outward witness of our inward faith proclaims to the world that Jesus is truly present among His people—not just in our churches, but in our neighborhoods, cities, and daily lives. It is an act of both adoration and evangelization: a living testimony that Christ walks with us and desires to bless our communities with His peace. Let us join in this ancient and powerful tradition with hearts full of faith, gratitude, and love.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. John the Baptist (1st century)

Feast Day: June 24

The Nativity of St. John the Baptist is one of only three birthdays celebrated in the Church's liturgical calendar—the others being the Birth of Jesus (December 25) and the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (September 8). This rare honor highlights John's singular role in the history of salvation as the forerunner of the Lord.



His birth was announced by the angel Gabriel and marked by miracles: his mother Elizabeth conceived in old age, and his father Zechariah, struck mute for his initial disbelief, regained his speech at John's naming.

Filled with the Holy Spirit even in the womb, John's birth is seen as a light dawning before the coming of Christ. Celebrated near the summer solstice, his feast reflects the words he would later speak about Jesus: "He must increase; I must decrease" (John 3:30).

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Holy Communion

Question:

Why can't everyone who wants to receive Communion, receive Communion at Mass?

Answer:

Outside of the Church, many organizations have all sorts of requirements for membership: dues, achievements, professional standings, etc. The requirements bring the group together in common purposes and goals. Within the Church, there are also basic "requirements" for receiving the sacraments. As Catholics, we believe that the Eucharist is the true "Bread of Life." It is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving Jesus. Out of reverence for Christ, only those in union with this teaching and in a state of grace should receive communion. As Catholics, we should abstain from communion if we are in mortal sin.

While we share many articles of faith with our Protestant brothers and sisters, their understanding of this teaching is fundamentally different. For most non-Catholic churches, they do not believe that Christ becomes truly present in the Eucharist. As such, they should not receive communion in a Catholic Church. These differences are greater for people of non-Christian faiths, and even more apparent for those who do not believe in God. Receiving communion is not a right, but a gift to be accepted in humble, trusting faith.

Novena to the Sacred Heart for Pope Leo XIV

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS NOVENA FOR THE PONTIFICATE AND INTENTIONS OF POPE LEO XIV

This novena marks the conclusion of the jubilee of the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, beginning on the anniversary of Pope Leo's ordination (June 19) and concluding on the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (June 27).

Novena Prayers

I. For the Pontificate of Pope Leo XIV

O my Jesus, you have said: "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." Behold I knock, I seek and ask that you bless the ministry of Pope Leo XIV and give him the grace to embody Christ's love and wisdom as he shepherds your flock, the Church.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.

II. For the Holy Father's Prayer Intentions

O my Jesus, you have said: "Amen, amen, I say to you, whatever you ask the Father in my name he will give you." Behold, in your name, I ask the Father for the grace that the world might grow in compassion, and that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be.

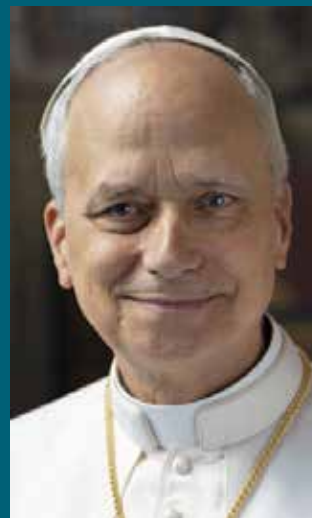
O Sacred Heart of Jesus, I place all my trust in you.
