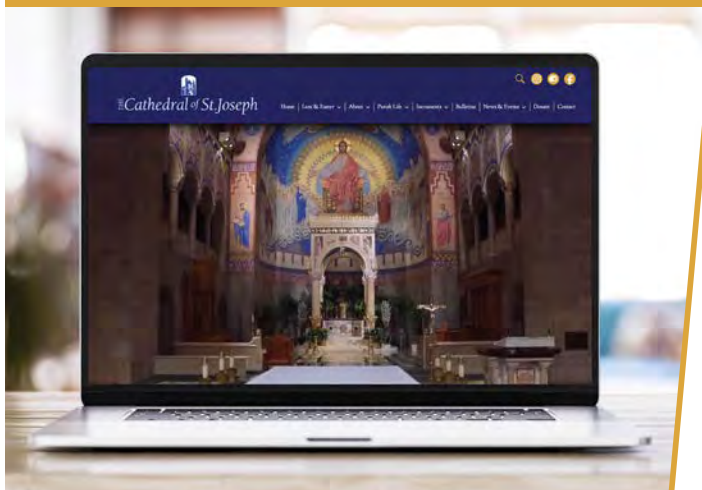

# The Sacred Heart of Jesus: A Journey into Divine Love

## Part 2: The Spiritual Significance of the Sacred Heart

*June is traditionally honored as the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. During this month, we will offer a series of reflections on the history and importance of the devotion to the Sacred Heart.*

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is not simply an image or a symbol—it is an invitation to experience Christ’s divine and human love in a transformative way. Through this devotion, we are invited to contemplate the depths of Jesus’ love for humanity, a love that is both infinite and deeply personal. The Sacred Heart is the ultimate symbol of Jesus’ sacrificial love, which was revealed to us on the Cross, and it continues to speak to us today with an invitation to love in return.

At the heart of the devotion is the recognition that Christ’s love is not abstract—it is personal, concrete, and sacrificial. The heart of Jesus, pierced for our sins, is a symbol of God’s great mercy, compassion, and love. It is a love that suffers for us, that forgives our sins, and that invites us to be transformed by its power. This love is not only meant to be admired from a distance but is meant to be received and shared.

The Sacred Heart devotion also carries with it a call to reparation. This means making amends for the many ways that humanity has neglected or rejected Christ’s love. Jesus, in His revelations to St. Margaret Mary, expressed His sorrow over the ingratitude and sins of the world, asking for acts of repara-

tion. Reparation is a way of responding to God’s love by offering our own love, our sacrifices, and our prayers to repair the damage caused by sin.

Living the devotion to the Sacred Heart calls us to become more like Christ, to embrace His love, and to embody that love in our relationships with others. As



we contemplate the Sacred Heart, we are invited to allow His love to purify our own hearts, enabling us to love more deeply, to forgive more freely, and to serve others selflessly. Through the Sacred Heart, we are reminded that love is not just a feeling—it is a choice, a commitment, and an action.

*O most holy Heart of Jesus,  
fountain of every blessing,  
I adore You, I love You,  
and with a lively sorrow  
for my sins, I offer You  
this poor heart of mine.  
Make me humble, patient, pure,  
and wholly obedient to Your will.  
Grant, good Jesus, that I may live  
in You and for You.  
Protect me in the midst of danger;  
comfort me in my afflictions;  
give me health of body,  
assistance in my temporal needs,  
Your blessing on all that I do,  
and the grace of a holy death.  
Amen.*

On the Friday following the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. Because this solemnity usually falls in June, this month is also known as the “Month of the Sacred Heart.” Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is of great antiquity in the Church. It was Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, however, who made this devotion widespread. The great promise of the Sacred Heart is most consoling: the grace of final perseverance and the joy of having Jesus’ heart as our sure refuge and infinite ocean of mercy in our last hour. During the month of June, let us ponder Christ’s infinite love and meditate upon his suffering for the salvation of the world.

- Pray the Litany of the Sacred Heart
- Start the First Friday Devotion

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### St. Anthony of Padua (1195–1231)

*Feast Day: June 13*

Saint Anthony of Padua was a Franciscan friar, brilliant preacher, and Doctor of the Church, known for his deep knowledge of Scripture and his love for the poor. Born in Lisbon, Portugal, he joined the Franciscans and hoped to be a missionary, but poor health led him instead to a ministry of preaching throughout Italy and France.



Anthony had a remarkable gift for explaining the faith with clarity and compassion. Crowds gathered wherever he spoke, and many were moved to conversion. He was also known for miracles during his lifetime and after his death—including finding lost items, for which he is now famously invoked.

He died at just 36 years old in Padua, Italy, where his tomb became a place of pilgrimage. Canonized less than a year after his death, his feast day is June 13.

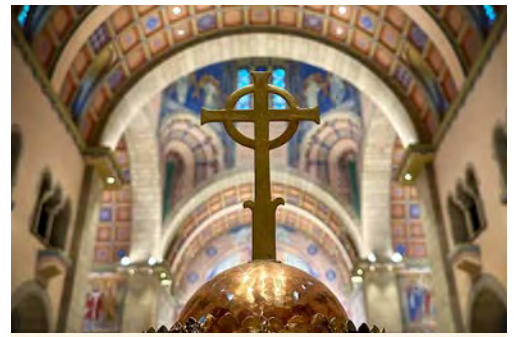

## WHY DO WE DO THAT?

### Catholic Life Explained:

*Incense*

#### Question:

Why do we use incense at Mass?

#### Answer:

The use of incense in religious ceremonies and worship is a practice that predates Christianity, and which is also found in many other religious traditions today.

Incense, which is made from resin infused with aromatic spices and oils, is one of those fundamentally human symbols that incorporates more than one of our senses, helping us to reflect on realities that transcend the everyday details of our lives.

The use of incense in the Church's liturgy — in the Mass, as well as in devotions to the Eucharist and the Liturgy of the Hours — is inspired by the use of incense in the Jewish tradition. In the writings of the Old Testament, we hear about incense being used in the worship of the temple, and Psalm 141 asks, "Let my prayer be incense before you; my uplifted hands an evening offering" (vs. 2). The image here is that, as the incense gently rises to heaven, our prayers also rise to God as something sweet and pleasant.

Another ancient use of incense that has also become part of our Catholic tradition is the idea that when we incense something, it's because it is something special or sacred. This is why the Book of the Gospel is incensed during the Liturgy of the Word and the bread, wine, priest celebrant, and congregation are incensed at the presentation of the gifts. To this, we can also add the incensing of the Blessed Sacrament during Eucharistic adoration and benediction, and the body of the deceased at the end of the Mass of the Resurrection (the Funeral Mass).
