RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

On this Second Sunday of Lent, the Gospel presents us with the Transfiguration of Jesus (Lk 9:28-36). Peter, James, and John witness His glory on the mountain as His face shines and His clothing becomes dazzling white. For a brief moment, the veil is lifted, revealing Jesus in His divine splendor. This powerful event was meant to strengthen the disciples' faith as they would later face His Passion. But it is also a reminder to us that God calls each of us to be transformed by His grace.

St. Paul echoes this in today's Second Reading: "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we also await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ. He will change our lowly body to conform with His glorified body" (Phil 3:20-21). Lent is not just about external practices; it is about inner transformation. Are we allowing Christ to change us? Are we striving to become more like Him in our words, actions, and love for others?

This week, we celebrate the Solemnity of St. Joseph, the Patron of both our Cathedral and our Diocese. To honor him, we will gather for Solemn Vespers on Tuesday, March 18, at 6:00 p.m. On Wednesday, March 19, we will celebrate a special Mass at 6:00 p.m., during which we will formally enshrine a new icon of St. Joseph, a beautiful gift from the Knights of Columbus. Following the Mass, all are invited to a reception in the Great Hall of Wheeling Central, where we can continue our celebration in fellowship.

St. Joseph quietly but faithfully lived out his vocation, always trusting in God's plan. May his example inspire us to embrace our own call to holiness. As we journey through Lent, let us open our hearts to Christ's transforming power, so that we too may reflect the radiance of His love to the world.

St. Joseph Icon to be Enshrined in Cathedral

A Gift from the Knights of Columbus to Honor the Patron of the Church

The Cathedral of St. Joseph in Wheeling will enshrine an icon of its patron, St. Joseph, in the narthex during a special Mass on the Solemnity of St. Joseph, Wednesday, March 19, at 6:00 p.m. This icon is a generous gift from the West Virginia Knights of Columbus.

The icon was part of the Knights of Columbus' pilgrim icon prayer program, a longstanding tradition in which a specially selected image is sent on a journey from council to council, inspiring devotion and strengthening communities in prayer. This particular icon, crafted by Elizabeth Bergeron, is based on a drawing by Alexandre Sobolev, depicting St. Joseph tenderly holding the child Jesus. The original icon is found in St. Joseph's Oratory in Montréal, Canada, a significant site of pilgrimage and devotion to St. Joseph.

The pilgrim icon prayer program has featured several revered images over the years, including icons of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Our Lady of Częstochowa, Our Lady of Pochoiv, Our Lady of the Rosary, Our Lady of Charity, Our Lady Help of Persecuted Christians, and the Holy Family. Each icon has served as a source of prayer, reflection, and encouragement for Knights and the faithful alike.



As this icon finds its home in the Cathedral, it will serve as a lasting reminder of St. Joseph's role as a protector and guide, encouraging all who enter to seek his intercession and emulate his virtues of faith, humility, and steadfast devotion to God.

Following the Mass, a reception will be held in the Great Hall of Central Catholic High School. All are invited to attend and are encouraged to bring a canned food item to donate to the local Catholic Charities Neighborhood Center.

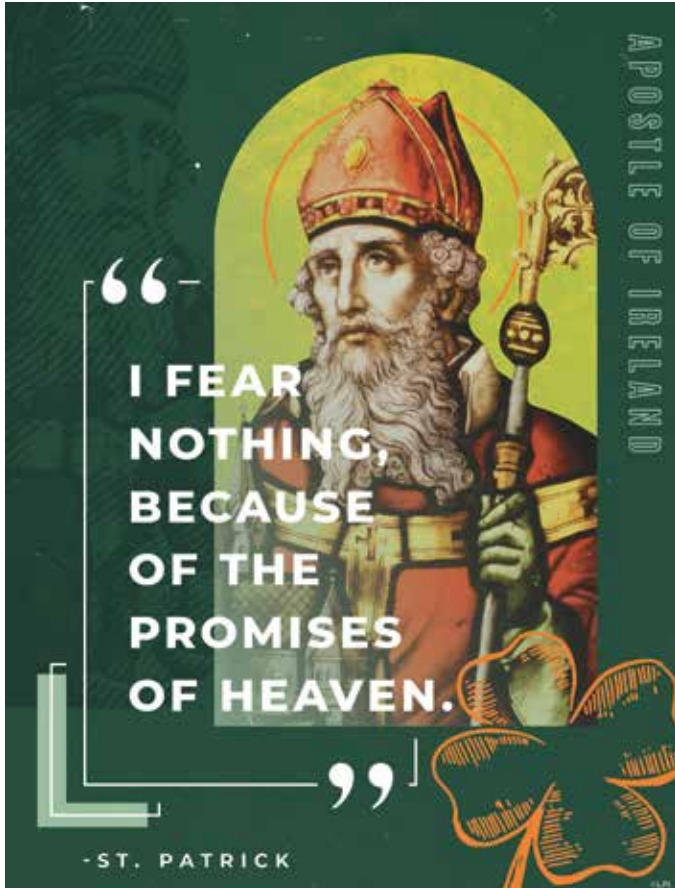
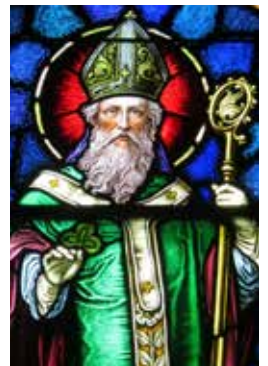
Saint Patrick (c. 385–461)

Feast Day: March 17

Saint Patrick, the beloved Apostle of Ireland, was born in Roman Britain but was kidnapped as a teenager and taken to Ireland as a slave. After years of hardship, he escaped, but later returned as a missionary, bringing the Gospel to the Irish people.

Through his preaching and miracles, he converted many, using the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity. He established churches, schools, and monasteries, helping to shape Ireland into a strong Christian nation.

CATHEDRAL MAINTENANCE FUND

Our beautiful Cathedral, rich in history and faith, is in need of some important repairs and upgrades to preserve its integrity for future generations. The Diocesan Office of Buildings and Properties and our Cathedral Finance Council has identified three critical maintenance projects that require attention:

Roof Repairs: A significant leak in the roof, especially problematic during strong winds, threatens further interior damage. The estimated repair is around \$145,000.

Wall Repairs: Cracked limestone near one of the transept windows needs urgent attention to prevent further deterioration. The estimated cost for this repair is \$9,680.

HVAC System Replacement: Our air conditioning system is aging, and the refrigerant it uses is now obsolete. The air handlers are nearing the end of their lifespan, with an estimated replacement cost of approximately \$250,000.

- Minister to the residential young-adult camp staff including supporting them, coaching them in healthy community life that includes strong relationships, and guiding them in personal and spiritual growth.

Additional Duties:

- Works early mornings, weekends, long hours, holidays/holydays as needed.

- Travel throughout the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston in the promotion of the Summer Camp program, the recruitment of young adults to work in said program, and the on-site visiting of camp properties as potential places to host future summer camps.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Lenten Reading

Question:

Can you recommend some good books for Lenten spiritual reading?

Answer:

On more than one occasion, a coach being interviewed about his team--successful or not--will be asked about the next step. The inevitable response includes something about getting back to basics. Reviewing the fundamentals of the sport strengthens performance and builds confidence.

The best Lenten reading takes us back to the fundamentals. If Lent is the time for the Church to be on retreat, then we should focus on the texts that help us deepen our understanding of our faith. Spend time reading one of the Gospels, and use a Scripture commentary to learn all you can about the passion of Jesus. Read about the lives of the saints, especially your patron saint and that of your parish. Perhaps there is some local candidate for sainthood, like Father Walter Ciszek, SJ, who wrote several faith-inspiring books. Finally, you can use the Catechism of the Catholic Church to learn more about the church's teachings and beliefs. The sections on prayer and the Mass are really great reflections. Focusing on the basics really helps us take another step forward in our faith. We have not only a better understanding of what we believe and practice, but also why we believe. With that belief comes the confidence we need to be better, more faithful witnesses to Christ.
