As we come to the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we are now very close to Holy Week. This Sunday's Gospel reminds us that Jesus has the power to bring life even where there is darkness and death. He calls us to trust in Him and to open our hearts more fully to His grace.

The Church invites us in a special way to prepare our hearts for the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of the Lord. These final days of Lent are a time to turn more fully to God and to open our hearts to His mercy.

One of the most important ways we do this is through the Sacrament of Confession. In this sacrament, we encounter Jesus who forgives our sins, heals our hearts, and gives us peace. It is never something to fear. It is a gift of God's love. As we prepare for Easter, I strongly encourage you to make a good confession, especially if it has been some time.

In addition to our regular confession times, we will have a Penance Service this Tuesday evening at 6:00 p.m. at St. Alphonsus Church. Please take advantage of this opportunity. Do not wait. Come and experience the mercy of God.


Let us use these remaining days of Lent well, so that we may enter into Holy Week and Easter with clean hearts, renewed faith, and deep joy.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

## The Passion of Jesus Love Poured Out for the World

At the heart of Lent stands the Passion of Jesus Christ, the saving mystery that reveals both the depth of human sin and the even greater depth of God's love. Each year, the Church invites us to return to the Passion narratives in the Gospels, especially the accounts proclaimed on Palm Sunday and Good Friday. These are not simply stories from the past. They are the living proclamation of how our salvation was won.

In the Passion, we see something extraordinary. God Himself has entered into our suffering. The Eternal Word, made flesh in the womb of the Virgin Mary, does not remain distant from the brokenness of the world. Jesus freely offers Himself, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, on the Cross. This is not an accident of history. It is a deliberate act of love. As the Lord Himself says, "No one takes my life from me, but I lay it down of my own accord" (John 10:18).

To contemplate the Passion, then, is to stand before love in its most complete form. It is to see a love that holds nothing back.

During Lent, the Church encourages us not simply to read the Passion, but to enter into it. When we pray with these sacred accounts, we begin to recognize that Christ's suffering is not distant from us. He suffers for us, and He invites us into that mystery so that we might come to know the beauty of His self-giving love. The Cross, which at first appears as a sign of defeat, is revealed as the very place where mercy triumphs.

But the Passion also speaks directly to our own lives. Each of us knows suffering in one way or another, whether through loss, disappointment, illness, or the weight of our own sins. We often ask why suffering exists and what purpose it could possibly serve. The answer is not

found in abstract ideas, but in a Person. It is in the Passion of Jesus that suffering finds its meaning.

Saint John Paul II, in his Apostolic Letter *Salvifici Doloris*, wrote, "In the cross of Christ not only is the Redemption accomplished through suffering, but also human suffering itself has been redeemed." In other words, suffering is no longer meaningless. When united with Christ, it becomes a path to grace, to transformation, and even to participation in His saving work.

This is one of the most profound truths of our faith.

Our suffering, when joined to the Passion of Jesus, is not wasted. It becomes powerful.

We are given the ability to offer our struggles, our pain, and even our daily sacrifices in union with Christ. In doing so, we participate in His redemptive love. We can offer these for our own conversion, for the healing of others, and for a world so deeply in need of mercy. In this way, even hidden suffering can become a source of grace, bringing peace, healing, and hope where it is needed most.

As we move through Lent, we are invited to return again and again to the Passion of Jesus, not only as something to reflect upon, but as the very source of our life. This same sacrifice is made present at every Mass, where the Cross is not repeated, but made present for us here and now.

So we come, not as spectators, but as participants.

And standing before the Cross, we begin to understand that the Passion of Jesus is not only something that happened. It is something that continues to transform lives, including our own.

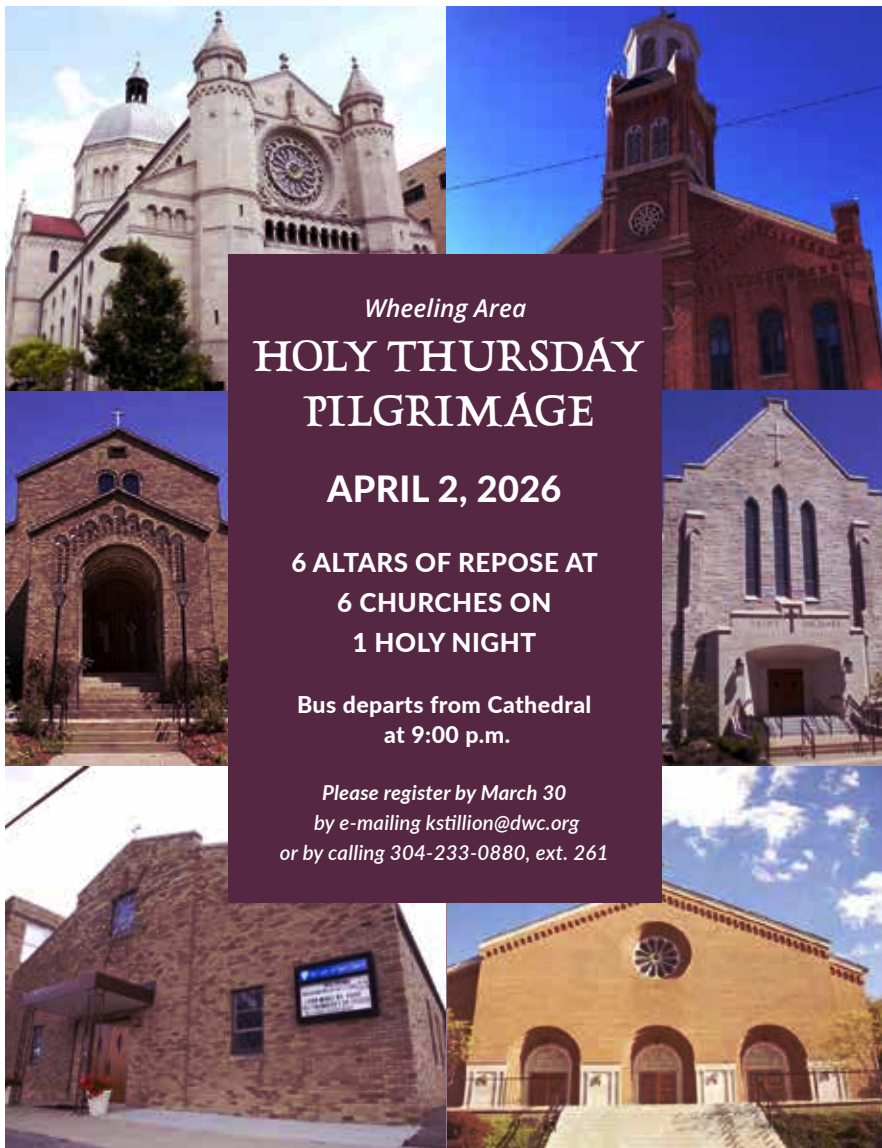

## WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained: *Holy See*

### Question:

Why is the Vatican sometimes called the "Holy See?"

### Answer:

A little background in ecclesiology will help explain why we call the Vatican the Holy See. The Church is very structured and organized in its hierarchy. A diocese is a geographic area governed by a bishop appointed by the Pope. Each diocese is further broken down into parishes, which have pastors who represent the bishop in his teaching authority.

The diocese of Rome has a particular role in the Church because of its importance and antiquity. The Pope is head of the Church because he is the Bishop of Rome. Every bishop has a seat or throne, which is the symbol of his teaching authority and is located in the cathedral of each diocese. The Latin word for seat is "sedes." So each diocese can be referred to as a "see." Most people think that St. Peter's is the cathedral of Rome, but St. John Lateran Basilica is actually the cathedral of the Archdiocese of Rome. This is where the Pope's seat or throne as Bishop of Rome is found. So, the Holy See is a reference to the chair of Peter, the Pope's Chair.
