RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Today's Gospel gives us the beautiful parable of the Prodigal Son (Luke 15:1-3, 11-32). It is a story that touches every heart—a son who has gone far from home, who has wasted what he was given, and who finally returns. But what matters most in this story is not the mistakes the son made, but the way his father welcomes him back—with joy, mercy, and love. Jesus tells this story to remind us that God is our loving Father, and He never stops waiting for us to return to Him.

This Sunday is also called Laetare Sunday, a day to rejoice even in the middle of Lent. We rejoice because God's mercy is always greater than our sins. Maybe your Lent started well—with good intentions, prayer, fasting, and generosity. But maybe it has become difficult, and you have fallen behind. You may feel like giving up, thinking it's too late. But it is never too late to return to the Lord. God is ready to forgive, to heal, and to welcome us back. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is the best place to meet Him and to receive His grace.

This weekend is also Commitment Weekend for the Catholic Sharing Appeal. This is a time when we join together as a Catholic family across our Diocese to support the ministries that serve so many people—like education, support for vocations, care for the poor, and retired priests. I am happy to share that we have already reached 50% of our parish goal. That means that from now on, every gift you make to the Catholic Sharing Appeal will directly support our Cathedral parish. Thank you for your generosity—it truly makes a difference here and throughout the Diocese.

As we walk these last weeks of Lent, let us turn again to the Lord. If we have wandered far, we know the way back. God is waiting for us—not with anger, but with open arms. Let us go to Him, receive His mercy, and rejoice together in His love.

Laetare Sunday: A Glimpse of Easter Joy

Why We Rejoice—and Wear Rose—on the Fourth Sunday of Lent

Why are we wearing Rose (again, not pink)?

It is Laetare Sunday, the fourth Sunday of Lent. A couple of interesting notes beyond the color of the vestments. The sanctuary may have flowers for this Sunday, unlike the other Sundays of Lent which call for a lack of any adornment. Also, the organ may play pieces which do not require singing.

Laetare (Rejoice) Sunday is on the calendar to give a reminder of the glory that we will celebrate in a few weeks. The glory of the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. Like the Transfiguration in the Gospel, where Christ is preparing His apostles for the trials they will face after His ascension to the Father, Laetare Sunday invites us to remember the promise of Easter;

the promise that the suffering done on Christ's behalf will be rewarded with a joy not known to humankind.

Hopefully, the sacrifices we have intended to carry out this Lent are going well. If not, it is not too late to begin anew. Lent offers a myriad of opportunities to go to Confession. We have begun offering time on Saturdays at 11:00AM at the Cathedral. Penance Services for both the Cathedral (Tuesday, April 8th) and St. Alphonsus (Thursday, April 10th) will be held at 6:00PM.

We cannot give what we have not received. May we ask the Lord's forgiveness, so that we in turn can give it away to others we encounter.

April Month of the Holy Eucharist

The month of April is dedicated to devotion to the Holy Eucharist. This tradition has developed because Easter Sunday often falls in April, and when it does fall in March, the Easter season continues on through all of April. In essence, April is a month of Easter, and during the Easter celebration we remember the Eucharistic sacrifice Christ gave us and the baptism in the Holy Spirit, which would come after Jesus's resurrection.

At the Last Supper, surrounded by His Apostles, Jesus gave to the world the most sublime gift of His Real Presence by instituting the Sacrament of the Eucharist – His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. Jesus took bread and pronounced the words: "Take and eat, this is my Body"; then He took a cup of wine and said: "Take and drink, this is my Blood. Do this in memory of me." With these words Jesus instituted the greatest of all of the Sacraments, the Sacrament of the most Holy Eucharist.

Ways to Honor the Holy Eucharist

- Truly prepare yourself to receive Christ in the Holy Eucharist by arriving early to Mass and spending time in prayer.
- Spend time in Eucharistic Adoration
- If you are not in the state of grace before receiving Holy Communion, go to confession

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Isidore of Seville (c.560-636)

Feast Day: April 4

Saint Isidore of Seville was a brilliant bishop, teacher, and writer who helped preserve and pass on the wisdom of the ancient world during the early Middle Ages. Born in Spain, he became Archbishop of Seville and worked tirelessly to strengthen the Church through education and unity.



He compiled one of the first encyclopedias, the *Etymologiae*, gathering knowledge on theology, science, history, and language—a resource used for centuries. Isidore promoted learning in the service of faith and helped guide the Visigothic people from Arianism to Catholicism.

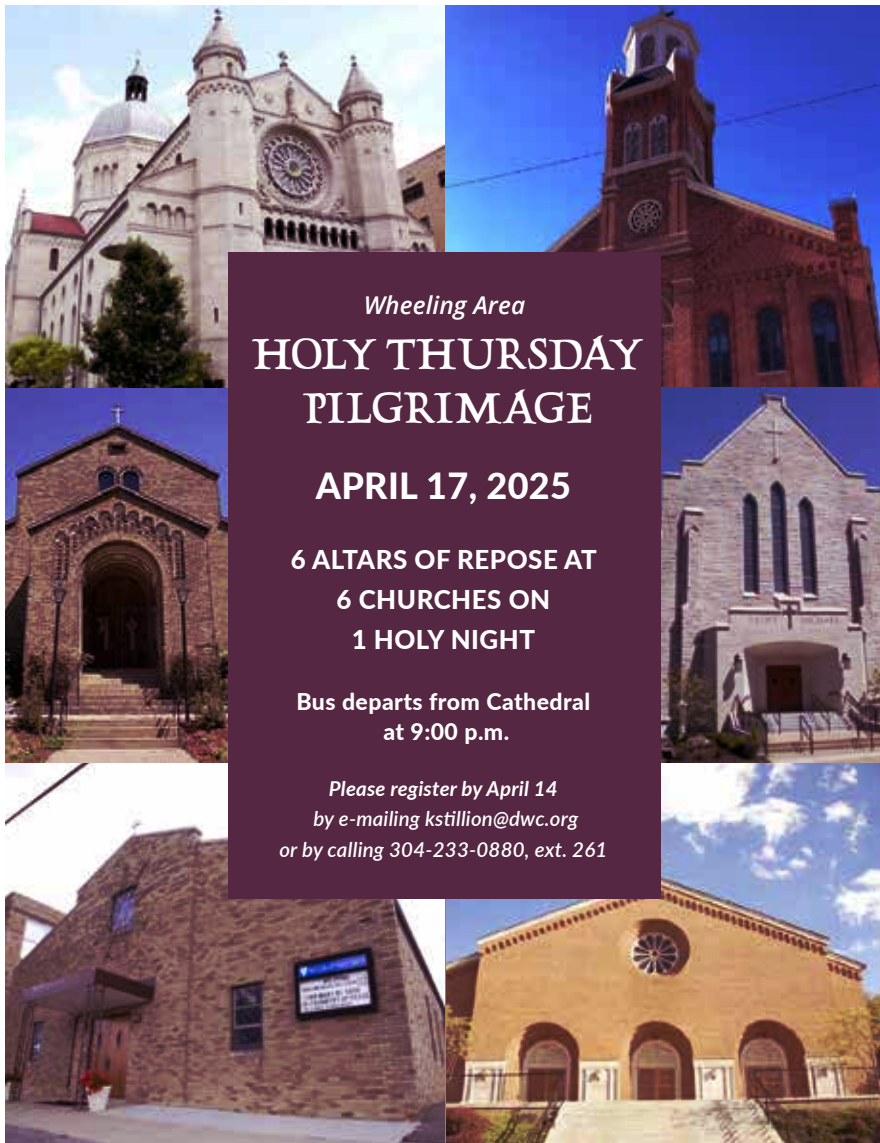
Declared a Doctor of the Church and patron of the internet and computer users, his feast day is April 4. *St. Isidore of Seville, pray for us!*

WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained:

Lent

Question:

Lent always seems to help me renew my relationship with God and strengthen my religious practice. Do you have any suggestions as to what I could do to achieve that the rest of the year?

Answer:

The obvious answer may seem to be to do whatever you do during Lent all year round. But part of the power of Lent is that we focus as a community on renewing our faith and preparing for Easter. Our Lenten practices have a purpose and a goal. Therein lies the secret. When we focus our efforts on one virtue, or try to change one bad habit, or seek to deepen our understanding of one aspect of faith, we focus our efforts and give our full attention to what we are trying to accomplish. We tend to be more successful achieving our goals. More importantly, it has a ripple effect in our lives: one thing changes or is added to the spiritual mix of our lives and many aspects are changed.

All too often we leave our spiritual growth to chance and the practice of faith to habit, and then wonder why we have no sense of growth or progress. Think of it in terms of exercise. We walk, lift weights, bend and stretch to attain the maximum benefit from what we do. In addition, to keep those benefits, we eat healthful food and get enough vitamins and rest. Spirituality requires the same kind of attention: we pray, fast, read the Bible, receive sacraments, and do charitable work to maximize the benefits of practicing faith. Keeping Lent year round keeps us in spiritual shape!

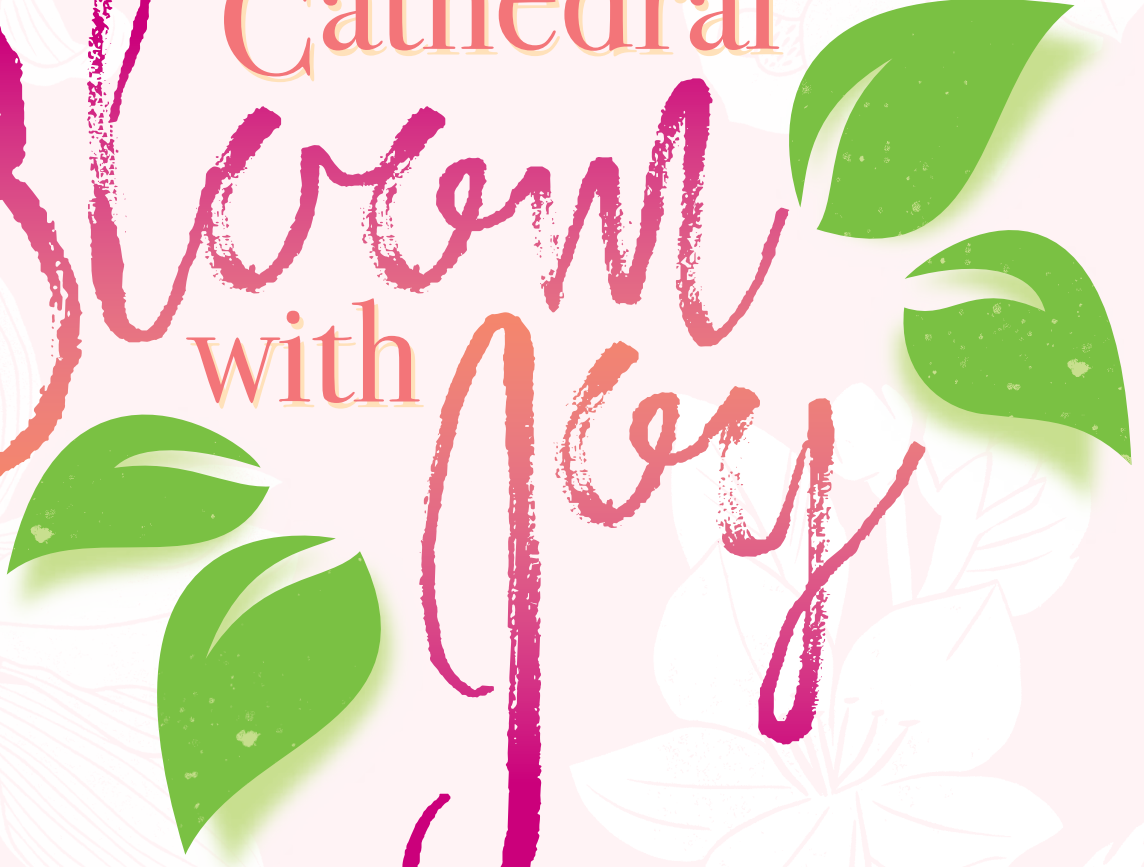
