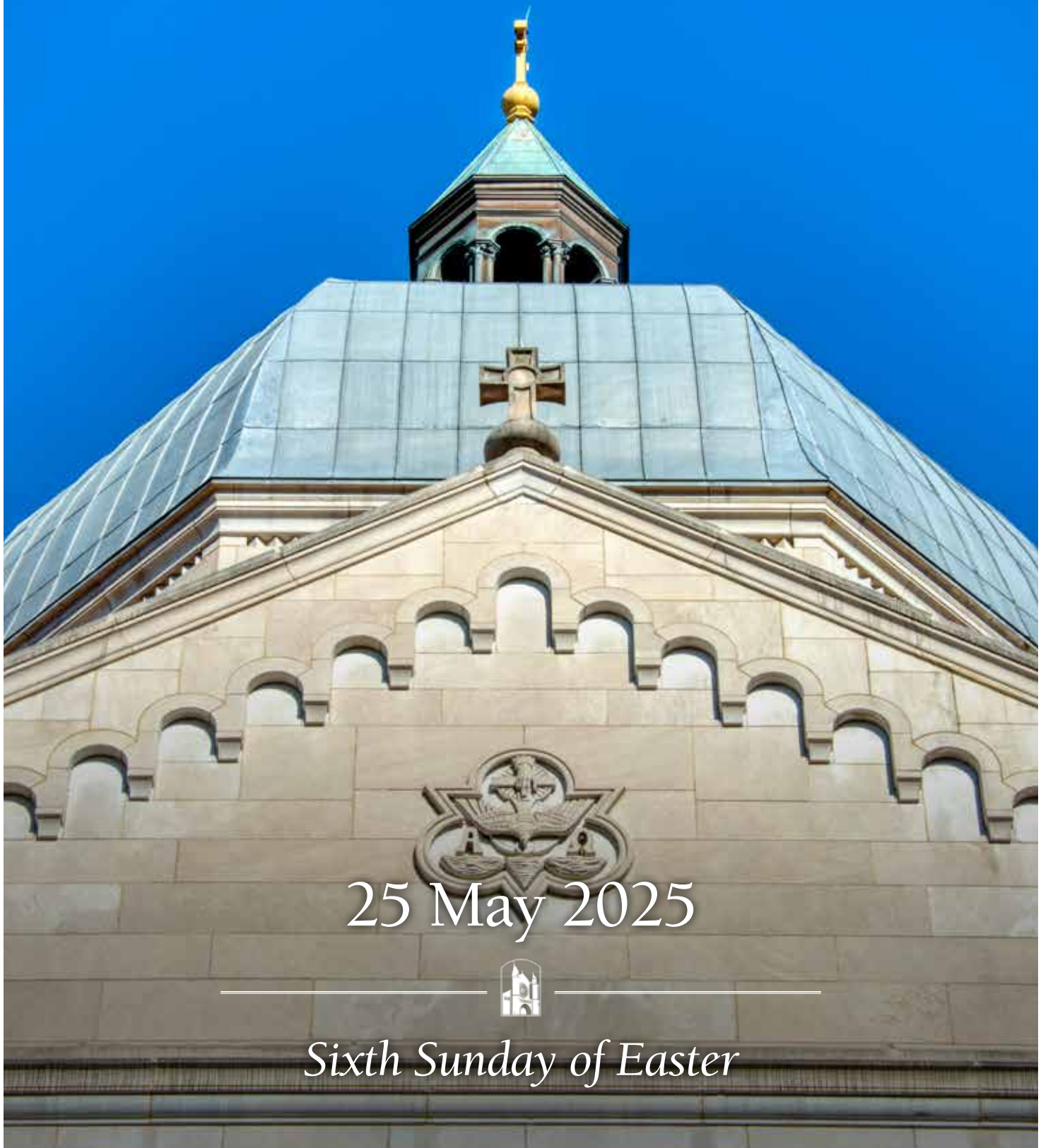

RECTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus offers His disciples words of comfort and promise as He prepares for His return to the Father. "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you" (John 14:26). As we draw closer to Pentecost, we are reminded that we are not alone. Christ has given us the Holy Spirit to strengthen us, guide us, and lead the Church in every age.

This coming Friday, May 30, we begin the traditional Novena to the Holy Spirit, praying for nine days as the Apostles did between the Ascension and Pentecost. I encourage you to pray this novena at home or with others. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to be poured out in abundance upon our parish, our diocese, and the whole Church throughout the world. In a special way, let us pray for our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, that the Spirit may guide him with wisdom, courage, and holiness as he begins his ministry as the successor of Saint Peter.

This Monday, we also observe Memorial Day, a time to honor the men and women who gave their lives in service to our country. As we enjoy the blessings of freedom and peace, let us never forget the cost at which those gifts came. We pray for the repose of the souls of all who died in military service, and for the consolation of their families and friends.

As we continue through this joyful Easter season, may the peace Christ promises us take root in our hearts. And as we prepare for Pentecost, may we open ourselves more fully to the power and presence of the Holy Spirit, who renews the face of the earth.

Preparing for Pentecost: The First Novena

Join us in prayer as we await the outpouring of the Holy Spirit

As we approach the great feast of Pentecost, we are invited to join in a powerful and transformative tradition: the Novena to the Holy Spirit. This special nine-day period of prayer holds a profound significance in the life of the Church.

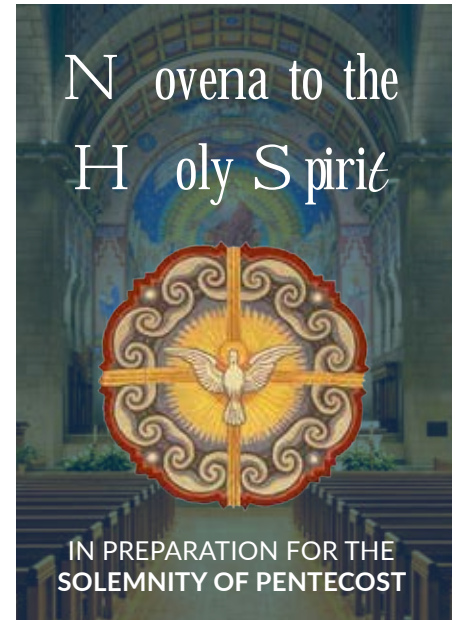
The Novena to the Holy Spirit is the first novena ever prayed by the disciples. After the Ascension of Jesus, the Apostles, along with Our Lady and others, gathered in the Upper Room in Jerusalem, waiting for the promise of the Holy Spirit. As they prayed together for nine days, they prepared their hearts for the coming of the Paraclete, the Spirit of Truth, whom Jesus had promised to send. This is the origin of the novena, and it serves as a model for all subsequent novenas in the Church's history.

In this powerful time of prayer, we reflect on the gifts of the Holy Spirit and ask for a fresh outpouring of the Spirit upon ourselves, our parish, and the entire Church. **The novena begins on Friday, May 30, and concludes on the Vigil of Pentecost, June 7.**

This year, let us make the Novena to the Holy Spirit a central part of our preparation for Pentecost. As we await the coming of the Holy Spirit, may we be transformed by His grace, ready to witness to the power of the resurrection in our daily lives.

Let us pray fervently for a new outpouring of the Holy Spirit on our parish, our diocese, and the Church throughout the world. The Novena is a powerful opportunity to unite as a community in prayer, asking the Holy Spirit to come and fill us with His gifts of wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and the fear of the Lord. May this novena lead us into a deeper encounter with the Spirit, filling us with joy, peace, and a renewed sense of mission.

Let us prepare for Pentecost with hearts full of anticipation, ready to receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit that will empower us to live out our calling as disciples of Christ.



Pentecost Novena Prayer

(To be prayed May 30 - June 7)

Come, Spirit of Wisdom, dispose our hearts to know and value the things of heaven above the things of earth and show us the way to salvation.

Come, Spirit of Understanding, enlighten our minds to the mysteries of salvation and grant that we may come to a fuller knowledge of you.

Come, Spirit of Counsel, guide us in the way of your commandments. Incline us to do good. Keep us from evil and bring us to everlasting life.

Come, Spirit of Fortitude, strengthen us in every trial and help us in our struggle against evil. Never let us be parted from you.

Come, Spirit of Knowledge, help us to see beyond the passing joys of this world to the glories you have prepared for us.

Come, Spirit of Piety, stir up our hearts to true holiness and love of you. May we always seek you in spirit and in truth.

Come, Spirit of the Fear of the Lord, teach us ever to set the Lord before us and to avoid whatever is displeasing to you. Bring us all one day to the fullness of your love.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

As it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

Hearts on Fire is our adult faith formation series, created to spark a deeper love for Christ and His Church through engaging study and meaningful conversation.

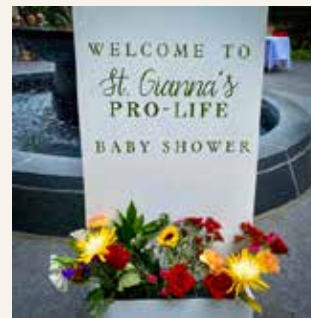


We'll be taking a short break for the summer, but Hearts on Fire will resume in August. We have some exciting topics in the works - stay tuned for more details later this summer!

LIVING OUR FAITH

MASS OF THANKSGIVING FOR POPE LEO XIV



Tuesday, June 10 | 6:00 pm

The month of May is the “month which the piety of the faithful has especially dedicated to Our Blessed Lady,” and it is the occasion for a “moving tribute of faith and love which Catholics in every part of the world pay to the Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of the home, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration. In this month, too, the benefits of God’s mercy come down to us from her throne in greater abundance” (Paul VI: Encyclical on the Month of May, no. 1).

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century. In this way, the Church was able to Christianize the secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. In the 16th century, books appeared and fostered this devotion.

The practice became especially popular among the members of the Jesuit Order — by 1700 it took hold among their students at the Roman College and a bit later it was publicly practiced in the Gesu Church in Rome. From there it spread to the whole Church.

Ways to Honor Our Lady

- Learn or pray a new Marian devotion (Regina Caeli, Litany of Loreto, Novenas to Our Lady, etc.)
- Decorate a statue of Our Lady with flowers
- Imitate Mary’s deep humility, obedience, and faith

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Philip Neri (1515-1595)

Feast Day: May 26

St. Philip Neri, known as the “Apostle of Rome,” was a joyful and charismatic priest who brought renewal to the Church through friendship, humor, and deep holiness. Born in Florence, he moved to Rome as a young man and dedicated his life to prayer, teaching, and serving the poor.



Ordained a priest in 1551, he founded the Congregation of the Oratory, a community of priests and brothers committed to preaching, music, and the sacraments. Philip was known for his cheerful spirit, wise counsel, and ability to draw others—especially youth—to Christ with gentleness and wit.

He spent hours in the confessional and had a special gift for guiding souls. Despite his popularity, he remained humble, often saying, “The shortest way to heaven is humility.”

Canonized in 1622, his feast day is May 26. Saint Philip Neri, pray for us!

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Sunday Mass

Question:

Why do Catholics need to go to Mass every Sunday?

Answer:

The heart of the Church's instruction that we are to attend Mass on Sundays goes back to the Third Commandment: "Take care to keep holy the sabbath day as the LORD, your God, has commanded you" (Deuteronomy 5:12). Although the Jewish People celebrate the Sabbath on Saturday, the first generations of Christians began to observe the sabbath on Sunday, recognizing how important it is for Christians to celebrate the day that Jesus rose from the dead. As the United States Catholic Catechism for Adults observes, "Sunday extends the celebration of Easter throughout the year ... It makes present the new creation brought about by Christ" (364).

The focus of our Sunday should be the celebration of the Eucharist in the Mass. This is our time to be formed by God's Word and nourished at the table of the Lord, becoming prepared to live out and share our faith in the week that follows. In his encyclical, *Dies Domini*, Pope Saint John Paul II reminded us that Christians "cannot live their faith or share fully in the life of the Christian community unless they take part regularly in the Sunday Eucharistic assembly" (no. 81). This is why the Church teaches us that Sunday Mass is a non-negotiable part of being a Christian (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2192).

Beyond being a time of worship, we should also remember that Sunday is intended to be a day of rest, when we make time for recreation, for sharing meals, and enjoying the company of friends and family. Sunday is given to us as a day to take stock of and enjoy the blessings that God has given us (see Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2187). Pope Francis reminded us, "The day of rest, centered on the Eucharist, sheds its light on the whole week, and motivates us to greater concern for nature and the poor" (*Laudato Si'*, no. 237).
