Today, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, a day when we honor the instrument through which our salvation was won. As Jesus tells us in today's Gospel: "When I am lifted up from the earth, I will draw everyone to myself" (John 12:32). The Cross reminds us that even in moments of pain and sacrifice, God's love triumphs, and new life is offered to all who believe.

It is an ancient and noble practice to pray for the living and the deceased at Mass. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is the greatest and most powerful prayer we have, since it makes present the saving fruits of Christ's redemption. Because of this, many parishioners seek to schedule Mass intentions for their loved ones.

Anyone may request a Mass intention for:

- A person who is living or deceased, Catholic or non-Catholic.
- Particular individuals or families.
- A special intention appropriate to the Eucharist, such as: World Peace, Vocations, Respect for Life, or Souls in Purgatory.

How to Request a Mass Intention:

Mass intentions will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis. **Requests for 2026 may be made beginning Tuesday, September 16, 2025, by:**

(Please note: No intentions will be accepted by mail.)

Guidelines:

- At the time the 2026 book opens, each household or group may request up to five (5) Mass intentions to allow fair opportunity for all parishioners.
- Requests will be scheduled as close to the desired date and time as possible; if unavailable, the nearest possible date will be offered.
- A \$10 stipend per Mass is suggested. Please make checks payable to the Cathedral of St. Joseph. However, no one will be denied a Mass intention due to inability to pay.

Behold the Wood of the Cross

A Sacred Opportunity to Venerate a Relic of the True Cross

This weekend at the Cathedral of St. Joseph, we are blessed with a rare opportunity: a relic of the True Cross will be displayed for public veneration following all Masses.

a man back to life (2 Kings 13:21), and the sick were healed simply by touching St. Paul's garments (Acts 19:11-12). Through physical objects, God often chooses to work spiritual grace.

Take a moment to pause before this sacred treasure. Kneel. Pray. Reflect. This tiny fragment of wood is believed to have been part of the very cross on which our Savior gave His life for us. It is not merely an artifact — it is a tangible connection to the greatest act of love in human history.



The Discovery of the True Cross

The Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, celebrated each year on September 14, recalls an extraordinary moment in the life of the Church. In the early 4th century, St. Helena, mother of Emperor Constantine, traveled to the Holy Land seeking the sacred places of Christ's Passion.

At Golgotha, beneath the ruins of a Roman temple, workers uncovered three crosses. Unsure which was Christ's, tradition tells us that a dying woman was brought forward. When she touched one cross and was instantly healed, the True Cross was revealed.

Constantine then built the Church of the Holy Sepulchre over Calvary and the tomb, and fragments of the True Cross were preserved and shared with churches around the world, allowing the faithful to venerate this sign of salvation.

Why Relics Matter

The Church has treasured relics for nearly 2,000 years as tangible reminders of God's saving work. Far from superstition, their veneration is deeply biblical: the bones of the prophet Elisha brought

The Church recognizes three types of relics:

First-class relics: a part of the saint's body or, uniquely, objects directly associated with the Lord's Passion — like the wood of the Cross or the nails that pierced His hands.

Second-class relics: objects personally used by a saint, such as clothing, a rosary, or a prayer book.

Third-class relics: items touched to a first- or second-class relic, carrying a share in its spiritual significance.

When we venerate relics, we are not worshipping objects. We honor God who worked mightily through His saints — and, in the case of the True Cross, through His own saving Passion.

Prayer Before a Crucifix

My good and dear Jesus,
I kneel before you,
asking you most earnestly
to engrave upon my heart
a deep and lively faith, hope, and charity,
with true repentance for my sins,
and a firm resolve to make amends.

As I reflect upon your five wounds,
and dwell upon them
with deep compassion and grief,
I recall, good Jesus,
the words the prophet David spoke
long ago concerning yourself:
"They have pierced my hands and my feet;
they have counted all my bones!"

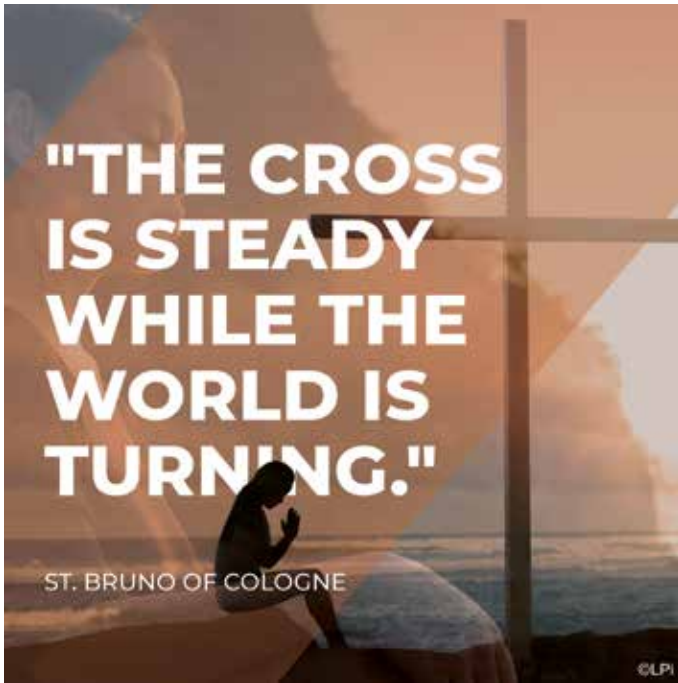

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179)

Feast Day: September 17

Saint Hildegard of Bingen was a German Benedictine abbess, mystic, composer, and Doctor of the Church, celebrated for her extraordinary intellect and spiritual insight. From a young age, she experienced vivid visions, which she later recorded in her renowned works, including *Scivias* ("Know the Ways of the Lord").



A true "Renaissance woman" of the Middle Ages, Hildegard excelled in theology, natural science, medicine, and music. She composed beautiful sacred chants and hymns that are still performed today, reflecting her deep love for God and creation.

Known for her courage, she advised popes, bishops, and emperors, speaking out on matters of faith and reform. In 2012, Pope Benedict XVI declared her a Doctor of the Church, recognizing her contributions to theology and spirituality.

Saint Hildegard's life reminds us of the harmony between faith, reason, and creativity.

WHY DO WE DO THAT?

Catholic Life Explained:

Jesus and the Cross

Question:

Why was Jesus’ death on the Cross necessary for our salvation?

Answer:

Humanity was created to live in perfect communion with God, but through sin, beginning with Adam and Eve, that relationship was ruptured. Sin brought separation from God and the consequence of death (Romans 6:23). No human effort or sacrifice could repair this brokenness. In the Old Covenant, animal sacrifices were offered for atonement, but these could only foreshadow the perfect and definitive sacrifice to come.

In His infinite love, God sent His Son to take on our humanity (John 3:16). Jesus freely offered Himself on the Cross as the spotless Lamb of God, the one perfect sacrifice for the sins of the whole world (John 1:29; Hebrews 9:11–15). By His obedience “unto death, even death on a cross” (Philippians 2:8), He bore the weight of our sins, reconciling us to the Father and restoring the possibility of eternal life (2 Corinthians 5:21).

The Catechism teaches: “By His obedient love unto death, Jesus accomplished the substitution of the suffering Servant, who ‘makes himself an offering for sin,’ when ‘He bore the sin of many’” (CCC 615; cf. Isaiah 53).

Jesus’ death was therefore necessary not because the Father demanded suffering for its own sake, but because love demanded total self-giving. On the Cross, Christ conquered sin and death from within, transforming the Cross — once an instrument of shame — into the sign of victory and the gateway to eternal life. His Resurrection confirms that the sacrifice was complete and effective: through Him, we are redeemed and invited back into communion with God forever.
